INVOCATION

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

CONFESSION

M: Great Good Shepherd, your greatness is beyond our highest praise! As we gather as your flock to worship you makes us to lie down in green pastures of your promises, lead us beside the quiet waters of tour comfort, restore our souls with the power the Gospel in Word and Sacrament, and lead us in paths of righteousness for your name's sake.

God invites us to come into presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. We turn aside from an unquiet world and seek rest for our spirit and light for our thoughts. We bring our work to be sanctified, our wounds to be healed, our sins to be forgiven.

- C: The King of love my shepherd is, Whose goodness fails me never; I nothing lack if I am his, And he is mine forever. (CW 375 vs.1)
- C: Where streams of living water flow, My Savior gently leads me, And where the verdant pastures grow, With food celestial feeds me. (vs. 2)
- M: Lord of life, we confess that we are by nature dead in sin.
- C: For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, for the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, You should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.
- C: Confused and foolish oft I strayed, But yet in love he sought me And on his shoulder gently laid And home, rejoicing, brought me. (vs. 3)
- C: In death's dark vale I fear no ill With you, dear Lord, beside me, Your rod and staff my comfort still, Your cross before to guide me. (vs. 4)

ABSOLUTION

M: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: You spread a table in my sight, A banquet here bestowing; Your oil of welcome, my delight; My cup is overflowing! (vs. 5)

And so through all the length of days Your goodness fails me never.

Good Shepherd, may I sing your praise Within your house forever! (vs. 6)

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: O Lord Jesus Christ, you are the Good Shepherd who laid down your life for the sheep. Lead us now to the still waters of your life-giving Word that we may abide in your Father's house forevermore; for you live and reign with him and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

FIRST LESSON Acts 20:28-32

²⁸ "Always keep watch over yourselves and over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has placed you as overseers, to shepherd the church of God, which he purchased with his own blood. ²⁹ I know that after my departure savage wolves, who will not spare the flock, will come in among you. ³⁰ Even from your own group men will rise up, twisting the truth in order to draw away disciples after them. ³¹ Therefore be always on the alert! Remember that for three years, night and day, I never stopped warning each one of you with tears.

³² "And now I entrust you to God and to the word of his grace, which has power to build you up and to give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

THE GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 15:1-7

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. ² But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

³ Then Jesus told them this parable: ⁴ "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? ⁵ And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders ⁶ and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' ⁷ I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.

C: And also with you.


M: Lift up your hearts.

THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION
