## **CONFESSION**

- M: When God created the world, he made the crown of his creation—the human race—in his image. Perfect people lived in a perfect world in a perfect relationship with God.

- C: The Shepherds' Candle kindles bright.
- M: Dispelling darkness, Jesus comes
- C: and warms us with his holy light.
- M: We see the shepherds on the hill
- C: who heard the angels' "Gloria,"
- M: who ran to find the holy Child
- C: and knelt in gratitude and awe.
- M: The shepherds were not slow to trust
- C: the angels' unexpected word,
- M: nor were those shepherds shy to share
- C: the miracle they'd seen and heard.
