
GATHERING RITE

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.


C: Amen.

During the introduction to the hymn, water is poured into the font.




- M I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit.
- C Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. (John 3:5,6)
- M Surely we were sinful at birth, sinful from the time our mothers conceived us.


 (Psalm 51:5)

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Genesis 6:1-19 7:5-16 (selected verses)

When human beings began to increase in number on the earth and daughters were born to them, the sons of God saw that the daughters of humans were beautiful, and they married any of them they chose. Then the LORD said, "My Spirit will not contend with humans forever, for they are mortal; their days will be a hundred and twenty years."

⁵The LORD saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the time. ⁶The LORD regretted that he had made human beings on the earth, and his heart was deeply troubled. ⁷So the LORD said, "I will wipe from the face of the earth the human race I have created—and with them the animals, the birds and the creatures that move along the ground—for I regret that I have made them." ⁶But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD.

³So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. ⁴So make yourself an ark of cypress wood;

"I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish. "But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark—you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you. "You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures, male and female, to keep them alive with you.

HYMN CW21 - BLUE #679 (1): "God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It"

God's own child, I gladly say it: I am baptized into Christ! He, because I could not pay it, Gave my full redemption price. Do I need earth's treasures many? I have one worth more than any That brought me salvation free, Lasting to eternity!

⁵ Noah did everything that the LORD commanded him.

⁶ Noah was six hundred years old when the flood came, and water covered the earth.

⁷ Noah went into the ark with his sons, his wife, and his sons' wives, because of the waters of the flood. ⁸ Clean animals, animals that are not clean, birds, and everything that creeps on the ground ⁹ went into the ark with Noah two by two (male and female), just as God had commanded Noah. ¹⁰ After seven days, the waters of the flood came on the earth. ¹¹ In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on that very day, all the fountains of the great deep burst open, and the floodgates of the sky were opened. ¹² The rain came down on the earth for forty days and forty nights. ¹³ On that same day Noah, Noah's sons Shem, Ham, and Japheth, Noah's wife, and the three wives of his sons along with them entered the ark. ¹⁴ They went in with every animal according to its kind... ¹⁵ Pairs of all the animals that have the breath of life in them went to Noah in the ark. ¹⁶ A male and female of each animal that breathes went in, just as God had commanded Noah. Then the LORD shut Noah in.

SECOND LESSON Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—because anyone who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

THE VERSE OF THE DAY

1 Peter 3:20-21

Alleluia! To those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ." Alleluia!

Sin, disturb my soul no longer: I am baptized into Christ!
I have comfort even stronger: Jesus' cleansing sacrifice.

THE GOSPEL Luke 3:7-16

⁷John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

- ""What should we do then?" the crowd asked.
- "John answered, "Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same."
- ² Even tax collectors came to be baptized. "Teacher," they asked, "what should we do?"
- ""Don't collect any more than you are required to," he told them.
- Then some soldiers asked him, "And what should we do?"
 He replied, "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely—be content with your pay."
- The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

HYMN W21 - BLUE #679 (4 -5): "God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It"

Death, you cannot end my gladness: I am baptized into Christ! When I die, I leave all sadness; To inherit paradise! Though I lie in dust and ashes Faith's assurance brightly flashes: Baptism has the strength divine; To make life immortal mine.

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
