THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON

Exodus 30:22-33

²² The LORD spoke to Moses again. He said, ²³ "Take fine spices: twelve and a half pounds of liquid myrrh, half as much (six and a quarter pounds) of fragrant cinnamon, six and a quarter pounds of fragrant cane, 24 twelve and a half pounds of cassia (weighed by the shekel of the sanctuary), and one gallon of olive oil. ²⁵ Make it into a holy anointing oil, a perfume mixed with the skill of a perfume maker. It will be a holy anointing oil. ²⁶ Use it to anoint the Tent of Meeting, the Ark of the Testimony, ²⁷ the table and all its utensils, the lampstand and its utensils, the altar for incense, ²⁸ the altar for burnt offering with all its utensils, and the basin with its pedestal. ²⁹ You shall consecrate them so that they may be most holy. Whatever touches them will be holy. 30 You shall anoint Aaron and his sons and set them apart, so that they may minister to me in the priest's office. ³¹ Speak to the people of Israel. Tell them, 'This shall be a holy anointing oil for me throughout your generations. 32 Do not pour it on the flesh of anyone who is not a priest. Do not make any other perfume like it with the same ingredients. It is holy. It shall be holy to you. 33 Whoever mixes any perfume like it or whoever puts any of it on anyone who is not a priest shall be cut off from his people."

THE SECOND LESSON

Colossians 1:15-20

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation, 16 for in him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, things seen and unseen, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. 17 He is before all things, and all things hold together in him.18 He is also the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that in all things he might have the highest rank. 19 For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, 20 and through him to reconcile all things to himself (whether things on earth or in heaven) by making peace through the blood of his cross.

CW21 Blue #530 (3): Praise Be to Christ



THE GOSPEL LESSON

John 12:1-11

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, the hometown of Lazarus, who had died, the one Jesus raised from the dead. ² They gave a dinner for him there. Martha was serving, and Lazarus was one of those reclining at the table with him. ³ Then Mary took about twelve ounces of very expensive perfume (pure nard) and anointed Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.

- ⁴ But one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was going to betray him, said, ⁵ "Why wasn't this perfume sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" ⁶ He did not say this because he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief. He held the money box and used to steal what was put into it.
- ⁷ Jesus replied, "Leave her alone. She intended to keep this for the day of my burial. ⁸ Indeed, the poor you always have with you, but you are not always going to have me."
- ⁹A large crowd of the Jews learned that he was there. They came not only because of Jesus, but also to see Lazarus, whom he raised from the dead. ¹⁰ So the chief priests made plans to kill Lazarus too, ¹¹ because it was on account of him that many of the Jews were leaving them and believing in Jesus.



SERMON John 12:1-11
