The Word

The First Lesson Genesis 32:7-12; 22-30

⁷So Jacob was terrified and very distressed. He divided the people who were with him, as well as the flocks, and the herds, and the camels, into two camps. ⁸ He said, "If Esau comes to one camp and strikes it, then the other camp will escape." ⁹ Jacob said, "God of my father Abraham and God of my father Isaac, the LORD, who said to me, 'Return to your country and to your relatives, and I will do good for you,' ¹⁰ I am not worthy of even a bit of all the mercy and all the faithfulness that you have shown to your servant, for I crossed over this Jordan with just my staff, and now I have

grown into two camps. ¹¹ Please deliver me from the hand of my brother, from the hand of Esau, for I am afraid that he will come and strike me and the mothers, as well as the children. ¹² You said, 'I will surely do good for you and make your descendants like the grains of sand of the sea, which cannot be counted because there are so many.'"

²² He got up that night and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven sons, and crossed over the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and he also sent his possessions across. ²⁴ Jacob was left alone, and he wrestled with a man there until daybreak. ²⁵ When the man saw that he could not defeat him, he touched the socket of his thigh, and the socket of Jacob's thigh was dislocated as he wrestled. ²⁶ The man said, "Let me go. It's daybreak."

Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me."

²⁷ Then he said to him, "What is your name?"

He said, "Jacob."

²⁸ Then he said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have fought with God and with men, and you have won."


²⁹ Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name."

³⁰ Jacob named the place Peniel, because he said, "I have seen God face-to-face, and my life has been spared."


The Psalm of the Day

so that your youth is renewed like the / eagle's. Refrain




The Lord is compassionate and / gracious, slow to anger, abound-/ing in love.

²¹ Then Peter came up and asked Jesus, "Lord, how many times must I forgive my brother when he sins against me? As many as seven times?"

- ²² Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but I tell you as many as seventy-seven times. ²³ For this reason the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. ²⁴ When he began to settle them, a man who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him. ²⁵ Because the man was not able to pay the debt, his master ordered that he be sold, along with his wife, children, and all that he owned to repay the debt.
- ²⁶ "Then the servant fell down on his knees in front of him, saying, 'Master, be patient with me, and I will pay you everything!' ²⁷ The master of that servant had pity on him, released him, and forgave him the debt.
- ²⁸ "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him one hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began choking him, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!'
- ²⁹ "So his fellow servant fell down and begged him, saying, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back!' ³⁰ But he refused. Instead he went off and threw the man into prison until he could pay back what he owed.
- ³¹ "When his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were very distressed. They went and reported to their master everything that had taken place.
- ³² "Then his master called him in and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt when you begged me to. ³³ Should you not have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had mercy on you?' ³⁴ His master was angry and handed him over to the jailers until he could pay back everything he owed.
- ³⁵ "This is what my heavenly Father will also do to you unless each one of you forgives his brother from his heart."
