## The Word

#### **The First Lesson**

Exodus 14:5-18;30-31

<sup>5</sup> When the king of Egypt was told that the people had fled, Pharaoh and his officials had a change of heart concerning the people. They said, "What have we done? We have let Israel go! They will not serve us anymore!" <sup>6</sup> So Pharaoh prepared his chariot and took his troops with him. <sup>7</sup> He also took six hundred of the best chariots and all the other chariots of Egypt with officers over all of them. <sup>8</sup> The LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh, king of Egypt, so that he pursued the Israelites. The Israelites were going out defiantly. <sup>9</sup> The Egyptians pursued them. All the horses and chariots of Pharaoh, his charioteers, and his army caught up with them where they were camping by the sea...

<sup>10</sup> As Pharaoh approached, the Israelites looked up, and there were the Egyptians marching after them. The Israelites were terrified and cried out to the LORD. <sup>11</sup> They said to Moses, "Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you took us to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us by bringing us out of Egypt? <sup>12</sup> Wasn't this what we said to you in Egypt, 'Leave us alone. Let us serve the Egyptians'? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness."
<sup>13</sup> Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm, and see the salvation from the LORD, which he will perform for you today. For the Egyptians you see today, you will never see again. <sup>14</sup> The LORD will fight for you. You must wait quietly."
<sup>15</sup> The LORD said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the Israelites to set out. <sup>16</sup> As for you, lift up your staff, stretch out your hand over the sea, and divide the


sea so that the Israelites can go through the middle of the sea on dry ground. <sup>17</sup> I myself will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go into the sea after them, and I will gain glory through Pharaoh and his entire army, through his chariots and his charioteers. <sup>18</sup> The Egyptians will know that I am the LORD, when I have gained glory through Pharaoh, his chariots, and his charioteers."

<sup>30</sup> On that day the LORD saved Israel from the hand of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. <sup>31</sup> Israel saw the mighty hand which the LORD put into action against the Egyptians, and the people feared the LORD and believed in the LORD and in Moses, his servant.



### The Gospel Lesson

<sup>5</sup> On that day, when evening came, Jesus said to them, "Let's go over to the other side." <sup>36</sup> After leaving the crowd behind, the disciples took him along in the boat, just as he was. #### **The Nicene Creed**
