THE WORD

FIRST LESSON Isaiah 12:1-6

In that day you will say:

I will give thanks to you, LORD, for though you were angry with me, your anger has turned away, and you comfort me.

- ² Surely God is my salvation. I will trust him and will not be afraid, because Yah, the LORD, is my strength and song, and he has become my salvation.
- ³ Therefore with joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.
- ⁴ In that day you will say:

Give thanks to the LORD! Proclaim his name.

Declare among the peoples what he has done.

Proclaim that his name is exalted!

⁵ Sing to the LORD, for he has done amazing things!

SECOND LESSON Romans 10:1-9

Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God on behalf of the Israelites is that they may be saved. ² Indeed, I testify about them that they have a zeal for God, but it is not consistent with knowledge. ³ Since they were ignorant of the righteousness from God and sought to establish their own righteousness, they did not submit to the righteousness from God. ⁴ For to everyone who believes, Christ is the end of the law, resulting in righteousness. ⁵ Indeed, Moses writes this about the righteousness that comes by the law: "The one who does these things will live by them." ⁶ But the righteousness that comes by faith speaks like this: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith that we are proclaiming. ⁹ Certainly, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.



THE GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 27:11-26

"When Jesus stood in the presence of the governor, the governor asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Jesus said to him, "It is as you say."

¹² When he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he answered nothing. ¹³ Then Pilate said to him, "Don't you hear how many things they are testifying against you?" ¹⁴ But he did not answer him—not even one word, so that the governor was very surprised. ¹⁵ At the time of the Festival the governor had a custom to release to the crowd any one prisoner they wanted. ¹⁶ At that time they were holding a notorious prisoner named Barabbas. ¹⁷ So when they were assembled, Pilate said to them,

"Which one do you want me to release to you? Barabbas—or Jesus, who is called Christ?" ¹⁸ For Pilate knew that they had handed Jesus over to him because of envy. ¹⁹ While he was sitting on the judgment seat, Pilate's wife sent him a message. "Have nothing to do with that righteous man," she said, "since I have suffered many things today in a dream because of him." ²⁰ But the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowd to ask for Barabbas and to have Jesus put to death. ²¹ The governor asked them, "Which of the two do you want me to release to you?" "Barabbas!" they said.

²² Pilate said to them, "Then what should I do with Jesus, who is called Christ?" They all said to him, "Crucify him!"

²³ But the governor said, "Why? What has he done wrong?" But they kept shouting even louder: "Crucify him!"

²⁴ When Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing and that instead it was turning into a riot, he took water, washed his hands in front of the crowd, and said, "I am innocent of this righteous man's blood. It is your responsibility."

²⁵ And all the people answered, "Let his blood be on us and on our children!"

²⁶ Then he released Barabbas to them, but he had Jesus flogged and handed him over to be crucified.



NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our

salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.
