As Jesus was setting out on a journey, one man ran up to him and knelt in front of him. He asked, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good except one—God. You know the commandments. 'You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not give false testimony. You shall not defraud. Honor your father and mother.""

The man replied, "Teacher, I have kept all these since I was a child."





Jesus looked at him, loved him, and said to him, "One thing you lack. Go, sell whatever you have, and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." (Mark 10:17-21)

"I'm sorry," I said. "It's all good," came the response.

I knew what they meant, but it wasn't exactly the response I was looking for. I wasn't looking for a reply that would simply ignore or excuse what I had done under the under the statement "It's all good." That just didn't feel right to me. I was expecting a response indicating either forgiveness or not maybe even a shot at reconciliation. The fact of the matter is that we live in a world that is anything but "all good". That's why I apologized.

In fact, I have *no* good apart from God. Jesus said that ONLY God is good. Do you believe that or do you think your life is filled with lots of good things, among which one good is God? Perhaps you even place Him as the highest good. Yet Jesus challenges us to live a life in which God is *the* <u>only</u> good for us, for all. How would your life be reoriented if you believed that God is the <u>only</u> true Source of any good you have?

Jesus lived that way. He lived knowing that God alone is good. Because God was His only source of good, because loving God was His highest good, Jesus lived for us in love. Of course, then Jesus died for us in love, but God raised Him from the dead because death could not hold him. His life was "good" not by the world's standards but by God's standards. Very good. Perfect. In place of your sin, God gives you His perfect and complete forgiveness in Christ. In contrite faith we come before God assured of the Father's merciful gift of forgiveness through His Son Jesus Christ.

So, when you repent, when you say you're sorry, God doesn't just ignore your sin... He forgives you and He removes your sin, giving you the righteousness of Jesus Christ. That's God's standard of "good". He removes it from you for the sake of Jesus. When we repent God reminds us of how he addressed all sin at the cross once for all and then He treats you and me as if our sin never happened at all and remembers it no more. God's goodness is yours because of Jesus. And that truly is *all good*.

Grace Church Financial Update



"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing... If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. – John 15

We are One Together in ministry. Jesus is the Vine we are the branches and connected to him we will produce much! In fact, connected to Him all things are possible!

The approved budget: Our Grace budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 is set at \$490,000 which calls for weekly gifts of \$9423. Last week's gifts totaled \$8165.

Year to date: As of last week, the total amount of gifts we <u>should have</u> reached is **\$386,346**. However, at week 41, the amount in gifts <u>we have received</u> for the Lord's ministry is **\$305,731**.

We are grateful for the gifts of love that God's people have brought! We are asking you to prayerful consider how you can use your gifts to help address our current needs and budget shortfall.

Shortfall: Currently, there is a gap of **\$80,615** between the amount received and the amount budgeted. To catch up, are asking members to consider <u>special gifts</u> or, an increase in weekly offering to **\$16,752** will be needed to make our budget.

Additional expenses:

- At the moment it would appear that our insurance will not cover the total cost of the school restoration from this winter's pipe burst and water damage.
- We are also in dire need of roof repair at the school.
- The demolition cost and fees for the properties next to school have greatly exceeded the bid that PMG gave to us.

Grace Ministry has been blessed with financial miracles. We pray that God's children will give generously and joyfully according to His will. We are One Together in ministry.

We are beginning our Confirmation Classes for students who are not able to attend during the week at GLS. This class is especially for 6th - 9th graders but younger students are also welcome to attend.



Running to Rebuild


I think you probably all remember the ice storm that hit the Portland area this January. Thousands of people felt the effects of the ice and cold- being left without power, making homes cold, and for some even having their pipes burst leaving an enormous amount of damage behind.

Grace Lutheran School was not immune to the damage. During the storm, pipes burst inside their kindergarten and pre-school classrooms leaving the rooms completely unusable. Efforts have been ongoing to restore these classrooms, but the financial toll has been significant!

This April 19th, I (Pastor Bourman) am running in the Banana Slug Backyard Ultra. It's a crazy running event. Here's how it works! Every hour, on the hour, each runner will line up on the start line and run a 4.16 mile loop. (Why that number? So that every 24-hour period marks exactly 100 miles!) You are free to run whatever pace you like. If you run quickly, you have more time to rest. If you run slowly, you don't tire as quickly. The race has no finish line, and only ends when there is only one person left.

Finances -- Financially, we have been working on several projects. We are wrapping up our property perimeter fence project with the installation of the gates this past week. We had a light project in the back section of our parking lot that we completed a month or two ago. Earlier in the year we had a surprise crack in our septic tank that needed immediate repair. We are in the process of getting quotes for a roof replacement within the next 3 years and doing a site evaluation on all our HVAC units, knowing we need to replace one unit right now. We also continue to support our families who need financial support to attend Evergreen. We know Christian Education is a sacrifice for families, over the past few years we have continued to increase the total amount of aid available to families to help make Evergreen possible. While this is a lot of projects and lofty goals, the best way to look at this is how blessed we have been to be able to have these conversations. There are many stories in Evergreen's past talking about week-to-week needs and struggles. We are blessed by generous donors and supporters who continue to give to help us change those conversations. We are able to grow and think bigger because of your support. Thank you!

FROM THE WELS

The number of vacancies for pastor, teacher, and staff minister positions continues to present a real challenge for congregations throughout our synod. At the direction of last summer's synod convention, a special task force has been formed to study the issue of enrollment at our synodical schools and bring



recommendations regarding how we can encourage more young people to prepare for the public ministry.

Thankfully, we are approaching the month of May when some relief will be provided for the vacancy situation. The Conference of Presidents will be meeting as the synod's Assignment Committee to assign teacher and staff minister candidates from Martin Luther College (MLC), New Ulm, Minn., and to assign pastoral candidates at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary (WLS), Mequon, Wis., to their first calls.

This year at MLC, 145 candidates will be available for assignment. Some of those will be teachers who will be assigned to their first calls; others who were assigned for one year last year will either be permanently assigned to the call in which they are now serving or be reassigned to new locations. Thirty-seven of the candidates are restricted in where they can serve due to marriage or other circumstances. Many of these will be assigned in May; others will receive assignments in the weeks and months after call day. **CALL DAY IS MAY 18th.**

At WLS, 27 men will be assigned as pastors. Most of those will serve in parishes; several will be assigned to one-year calls in one of our ministerial education schools as tutors. The Assignment Committee, with the input of the seminary, will also assign 40 men as vicars in congregations throughout our synod. Many of those will be assigned as "Vicars in Mission" to home mission congregations. **CALL DAY IS MAY 23rd.**

Assignment days at MLC and WLS are joyful days—joyful for the young men and women who learn where God will have them serve in the ministry and joyful for the members of the synod who see God keeping his promise to send workers into his harvest field. Keep giving thanks to God for these gifts to his church and keep praying that God will provide even more workers in the years to come.

Board For Home Missions: New start and enhancement requests received WELS Home Missions has received requests to start 16 new home mission churches and support 17 enhancements at existing congregations across North America. Each request will be thoroughly reviewed by a dedicated team of Board for Home Missions (BHM) members. The entire BHM will meet **April 18-19** to review and evaluate the requests. LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE EQUIPS MEMBERS TO SERVE

More than 1,300 WELS members gathered in Chicago in January for the WELS National Conference on Lutheran Leadership. For three days they dedicated themselves to learning about leading in the congregation and community as well as enjoying worship and fellowship. The conference was for all WELS members, both called workers and laypeople, men and women of all ages, current leaders and future leaders. About 47 percent of attendees were called workers, 44 percent were lay members, and 9 percent were high school or college students.

Sixty-one teenagers from WELS high schools attended the conference. One of the breakout sessions even featured a panel of high school students discussing their experiences and views.

"[Our church body] is hemorrhaging young adults, and you often hear people my age (or even older) speculating on why that is the case," says Jonathan Hein, coordinator of WELS Congregational Services. "So we wanted to have some presentations where we actually listened to young people. What are their views on why their generation is quitting church? What do they think we can do better to attempt to retain and reach young people today?"

Hein adds, "Teens want to be more than consumers of gospel ministry. They want to be doers of gospel ministry." The conference exposed them to some of the very real conversations happening in the synod surrounding leadership, ministry, and outreach.

EVERYONE OUTREACH

Thirty-six WELS congregations participated in an Everyone Outreach workshop in 2023. Everyone Outreach was designed by Kurt Nitz (pictured presenting at the National Conference on Lutheran Leadership) and Eric Roecker, the director of WELS Evangelism, to help congregations build a culture of outreach so that every member and every ministry is thinking about and participating in outreach.

When a congregation participates in Everyone Outreach, a facilitator visits the congregation for a two-day workshop. During the workshop, the facilitator uses group exercises and reflection, grounded in God's Word, to help members focus on outreach. After the workshop, the facilitator continues to encourage and support the congregation in maintaining an outreach mindset.
