
### Someone I know asked me about Lent...

Unlike Christmas and Easter Sunday, Lent is one part of the Christian calendar that is not usually well known in the secular world. When a friend or family member from outside the church asks you about the season's traditions and significance, you can share the beauty of the Good News through your answers.

### So, what is Lent, exactly?

Lent is the 40-day preparation for the events surrounding Easter, namely the suffering, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is observed by many major Christian denominations, including Lutheranism, Catholicism, and others.





### Why is Lent 40 days long?

This reflects the time Jesus spent in the Judean desert. According to the books of Matthew, Mark, and Luke in the Bible, Jesus fasted for 40 days and forty nights and overcame direct temptations from Satan during this time.

### What are the major special days during and around Lent?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Holy Week is the final week of Lent, starting with Palm Sunday, when Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Then, Maundy Thursday remembers the Last Supper, Good Friday commemorates Jesus' crucifixion, and, finally, Easter Sunday celebrates Jesus' resurrection.

### Do you have to give something up for Lent, like meat or a habit?

Some Christian denominations practice fasting, prayer, and study during Lent. These are not Biblical requirements, but many believers see these behaviors as ways to help them focus on the meaning of Jesus' life, sacrifice, and resurrection.

### How did Jesus act in the days before he was crucified?

Jesus understood that he was going to die and rise again, and he lived and taught perfectly to the very moment he gave up his life for us. <u>John 19:30</u> states his last three words were simply, "It is finished!"

### But if you know Jesus rose from the dead, why does Lent seem so dark and sad?

Jesus' suffering was physical, mental, and spiritual. He carried all of the sins of the world on his shoulders so that we would not have to receive the punishment we deserve. God gave up everything for us, and the reverent tone of Lent is many Christians' way of recognizing and respecting this great price he paid. Most importantly, however, this solemn time keeps Christians looking forward to Easter morning when Jesus triumphantly conquered sin and death. Because Jesus lived, died, and rose for us, we will enjoy eternal life with him in heaven.

Basically be was born with blood vessels that weren't formed correctly and they burst this morning. He has a very large bleed on the left side of his brain, rendering his right side paralyzed (hopefully temporarily). He was



life flighted from our local hospital to OHSU. He is expected to have surgery next week after they attempt to control the bleeding more.

Lots of thanks to all of you for praying for Joe and my family, my parents and all the help that has been given already and offered. Many have asked how to help and it would appear these are some ways we could use additional help:

- Meals, simple, like really simple meals even pbj type meals are welcome and appreciated. (Ask Pastor Bitter for contact information)
- Taking kids for an hour or two so my parents can take the dog for longer walks or just have a break. They can bring kids to you. This would likely be a more day of/day before request as we're kind of living day to day right now.

## Congregation Mission Offering subscriptions and statistics received



Every year at this time, WELS congregations submit their Congregation Mission Offering (CMO) subscriptions. These subscriptions represent the offerings that congregations prayerfully intend to provide for the work of the synod.

The subscriptions have now been received for 2021.

We're pleased to report that 98% of WELS congregations submitted CMO subscriptions for calendar year 2021. Those subscriptions total \$21,620,000. This level of CMO subscriptions is down slightly (0.6%) from actual CMO receipts of \$21.7 million in calendar year 2020, but it is 2.4% better than the originally approved plan of \$21.1 million for calendar year 2021. We thank God for moving his people to provide this generous support for the mission, ministry, and administrative work of WELS.


Congregations have also finished submitting their annual statistics for the year 2020. More than 95% of the congregations provided statistics on membership, worship attendance, confirmations, baptisms, and funerals as well as information on school enrollments and offerings. Even though the goal is to have 100% of congregations submitting statistics, the percentage of WELS congregations submitting statistics compares very well with other church bodies. These statistics are being compiled and will be available in the coming weeks.

The book of Proverbs is a collection of wise sayings, many of which are attributed to Solomon. Proverbs urges the reader to make decisions based on wisdom, justice, and righteousness (Pr 1:3). His sayings are sometimes direct instructions (Pr 1:10), sometimes general observations (Pr 20:14).

The book of Proverbs directs Christians to live God-pleasing lives and also shows the consequences of sin. The book has been called the Sermon on the Mount of the Old Testament. Both instruct believers on how to live lives of love. Solomon, a man of wisdom and great insight, wrote most of this book. He proclaims that real wisdom begins with the fear of the Lord.

### MOST FAMOUS VERSES:

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. **Proverbs 3:5**A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies. **Proverbs 31:10** 

Solomon rules with wisdom and justice, and all Israel prospers (1 Ki 4:20, 25). The writer of <u>First</u>
Kings gives us an idea of just how wise Solomon was:

"Solomon's wisdom surpassed the wisdom of all the sons of the east and all the wisdom of Egypt. He also spoke 3,000 proverbs, and his songs were 1,005. He spoke of trees, from the cedar that is in Lebanon even to the hyssop that grows on the wall; he spoke also of animals and birds and creeping things and fish. Men came from all peoples to hear the wisdom of Solomon, from all the kings of the earth who had heard of his wisdom."
