### Comfort in the midst of conflict:

### **Revelation 6-7**

Most are aware that this world is fraught with peril. People strive to protect themselves and their loved ones from physical harm. But how many live with an awareness of the ultimate threat to humanity?

The Lamb opens the seventh seal to reveal it . . . tick, tick, tick . . . 30 silent minutes pass, as if to say, "This is important! Pay attention!"

### The first five trumpets


The final seal lifts the curtain on a new

scene—a vision of seven angels with trumpets. The details are difficult, but the main message becomes clear if we keep some things in mind: Remember the words of Jesus about the coming end of the world (Matthew chapter 24).

It is worth noting that the most important parts of his speech, which speaks of false teaching (false prophets and messiahs) and its devastating effects (spiritual deception, increase of wickedness, love growing cold), are missing from the first six opened seals.

The vision of the trumpets is ushered in by the opening of the final seal—another view of the future. Reading Matthew 24 and these chapters can show the connection. The seals and trumpets cover the same time frame, both ending with the last judgment, showing that these trumpet activities are happening alongside the physical calamities.

Many faithful Christians before us have seen in this vision a picture of false teaching and ungodly living from the time of Jesus' ascension until his return. As you read about the first five trumpets (Revelation 8:6–9:12), focus on the truth that change or denial of God's lifegiving, light-giving Word causes the ultimate damage and destruction to people in our world.



### The sixth and seventh trumpets

The sixth trumpet is rather extensive, covering multiple chapters (Revelation 9:13–11:14). We first hear of a vast and vicious army bent on destruction. Then John sees an angel whose description fits Jesus himself. Giving a scroll to eat depicts the receiving of God's Word (cf. Ezekiel 3). The message of salvation in Christ brings sweet comfort to the believer's soul. It also becomes the source of sour discomfort when the gospel and its messengers are ridiculed and rejected. Even so, John and all believers are called to speak the Word of Christ to the nations.

Important symbolic numbers are introduced in chapter 11 (1,260 days = 42 months = 3 and a half times/years). Being half of the covenant number 7, they seem to represent the full New Testament age where the truth of God's



Word is continually challenged by false teaching, false believers, and a hostile unbelieving world. Believers who share the truth will be few in number in comparison with the unbelieving world. But their surprising influence and effectiveness is because they speak the powerful Word of God.

Many times throughout history, God's Word is all but muted, even in the visible church. The two witnesses, who represent this ongoing reality, remind us of God's faithfulness. Their death seems to show that, toward the end, Satan will be allowed to virtually silence God's truth altogether. But by God's grace, it will be a short time.

In the very end, God's Word and its faithful witnesses are vindicated, a comfort to which we cling. The seventh trumpet sounds, and the end comes.

After spending a lovely time in the Cancun area with family and friends, it was time for Sue and me to prepare for the long car drive to Mahahual. We would be visiting the mission and celebrating Día del Niño (Children's day) with the members; I don't think we could have chosen a better Sunday! We purchased a piñata and candy for the children to celebrate this special day.

On Saturday, May 1, we arrived late in the afternoon. We were greeted by Missionary Martin Vallesky, who was busy preparing for the







following day. We had brought a large duffle with 35 backpacks for the smaller children and 15 larger ones for the older kids. We had also purchased craft items, bracelets, cross necklaces, cross door hangers to hand out after the service.

Sue and I set out early Sunday morning to purchase snacks for Bible class and after the service. That morning the driver called in sick, and Meghan had to take his place driving and collecting families, so we were in charge of snacks, juice, and coffee. The kitchen needed a little TLC due to all the ongoing construction, and soon some of the church member women joined us. They seemed so proud of their new kitchen! We introduced ourselves and had a wonderful visit before the service.

Meanwhile, staff members Meghan and Chris were busy filling up their vans, as they picked up member families in time for the service. And soon, the church was full! The service theme honored the children, as Missionary Vallesky delivered a message about the adoption of God's children.

Several of the older children did the lesson readings. Meghan's friend Jennifer led the children with the familiar song, "This Little Light of Mine" (Esta Lucecita Mía). At Pastor's request, I had the chance to say a few words about our connection with Martin's family back in Houston and spoke of the gratitude I have for the support of Martin's father, Pastor Vallesky, over the years.

Soon came time for the breaking of the piñatas! Plenty of candy for all! We prepared a light lunch for the children, and there were









lots of happy faces. After the piñatas, we handed out the backpacks. No one left empty-handed!

We stayed to clean up while Meghan and Chris returned the members to their homes. We had plenty of time to tour the impressive new building and to see the adjacent house (it needs lots of work).

We had a lovely time visiting with the staff at Missionary Martin's favorite seafood place, The Big Fish. It was a great opportunity to hear their vision for the ministry and how we can support them. We returned to the US with two projects for our congregation in Portland:

- 2. Warm clothing for the children for the cold months
