Take heart! Your sins are forgiven!

"Jesus stepped into a boat, crossed over and came to his own town. Some men brought to him a paralytic, lying on a mat. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Take heart, son; your sins are forgiven." -- Matthew 9:1,2

Matthew chapter 9 is one of the most rapid-fire chapters of the Bible. In fewer than forty verses, we see Jesus perform at least seven miracles, answer questions and complaints from the teachers of the law, Pharisees, and even followers of John the Baptist. All the while we see him confidently going about his ministry, calling another Apostle, instructing his disciples, and explaining his purpose on earth: to forgive sins and save souls. He raises a girl from the dead. He reads minds. He heals the blind, the paralyzed, the demon-possessed, and a woman with



an unknown malady of constant bleeding. Except for time out to eat at Matthew's house, the text of the chapter suggests that these events happened in a very short period of time during a brief stay in Jesus' "own town."

Jesus' "own town" was Capernaum. This was his base of ministry in Galilee. Often he visited there, but he wasn't completely welcome there. In Matthew 11:20-24 we read that Jesus warned this city that it would be judged because the people refused to believe in him despite the miracles he performed in their midst.

But therein Capernaum Jesus shows us why he came into the world—he came to forgive sins. He said to the paralyzed man, "Take heart, son; your sins are forgiven."

When God declares our sins forgiven, we can be assured that they are completely gone because God cannot lie.

If your sins are burdening you, if your guilt is weighing you down, take heart. In Jesus, your sins are forgiven!



DEVOTIONAL THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK OF PENTECOST 4 2020

Sunday

Numbers 27:15-17

- Describe the request Moses places before the Lord? What does the way in which Moses addressed God say about how Moses felt about God?
- Was this a minor task which God and Moses were planning for Joshua? Explain.
- How do we view God's role in our lives and in the world? Isaiah 42:1-8 What gives God the right to feel this way?

Monday Numbers 27:18-23

- How does God express the fact that he is pleased with the choice of Joshua?
- Describe the process Moses is to follow in installing Joshua into his office as the chief leader of Israel? What important point does God make with this procedure?
- What tool is Joshua to use as he deals with and leads God's People?
- How does God's Word relate to the installation and work of a pastor? 2 Tim. 4:1-4

Tuesday 2 Thessalonians 2:16-17

- This is a prayer spoken by Paul. How does he describe the one of whom the request is being made?
 Discuss each of the glowing words and phrases.
- What is the basis for such a tribute of Jesus? One word.
- Discuss the request Paul makes of God. How did Jesus encourage us to make such a request regularly? Matthew 11:25-28

Wednesday 2 Thessalonians 3:1-5

- For what did Paul ask the Thessalonians to pray on His behalf?
- Why did Paul ask for this and why should we pray for our pastor, our leaders and one another? How often should we speak such prayers? James 5:13-16

Thursday Matthew 9:15-34

 What two kinds of miracles do we have here? What other two kinds of miracles did Jesus perform during his ministry?

- Review the four miracles and discuss what was involved with each one?
- What kind of diseases were these? Could just anyone heal them? Explain
- Agree or disagree: These were truly "mission impossible" for everyone except Jesus. Acts 2:22

Friday Matthew 9:15-35

- Look at each miracle: Did any of them give Jesus any trouble or did he perform them with ease? Explain your answer.
- What message is Jesus bringing to us with his miracle performances? Who is He?
- What was Jesus greatest and most important miracle? 1 Corinthians 15:1-22
- Agree or disagree: Death came through sin but was conquered by Jesus.

Saturday Matthew 9:36-10:8

- What is the harvest about which Jesus here is speaking? Why will this harvest in reality be another great miracle?
- How did Jesus picture all people? How bad off are all people spiritually?
- What kind of authority and responsibility did Jesus give his twelve Apostle?
- How thus the sending of the Apostles apply to us? John 20:19-23
