The Means of Grace SEPTEMBER 25, 2022



In the early days of our country a weary traveler once came to the banks of the Mississippi for the first time. There was no bridge. It was early winter, and the surface of the mighty river was covered with ice. Could he cross over? Would the ice bear his weight? With much hesitation and great fear, he began to crawl on hands and knees across the ice thinking that if he evenly distributed his weight he could keep the ice from breaking. About halfway across he suddenly heard the sound of singing behind him. He turned to see a man driving a horse-drawn load of coal across the ice and happily singing as he went. Here he was — on his hands and knees trembling in fear that the ice would not support his weight! And there went that man, his horses, his sleigh, and his load of coal, upheld by the same ice on which he was fearfully crawling! What



was the difference? One knew the ice had been tested and was strong the other wasn't sure.

And Pharisees came up and in order to test Him asked. (Mark 10:2a)

We get this a lot in the Gospels. Someone comes up to Jesus and asks Him some hard question in order to "test Him." But what does that mean? Is it a bad thing to do?

You'd sort of think so, given that most of the people doing it are acting like enemies. We hardly ever hear about someone saying, "Good answer, Jesus!" even when it's clear to all the listeners that Jesus has said something incredibly wise. Mark 12:32 is about the only case I can think of, where a scribe appreciates what Jesus says about the most important commandment. All the other questioners seem to disappear from the story—they slink out, and some of them even conspire to kill Him. This is the kind of testing that has a bad heart behind it—and it's the kind of thing God forbids when He says, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test" (Deuteronomy 6:16a).

But then there's the other kind of testing—the kind that you do when you're about to put your foot on a rock, and you put a little weight on it first, to make sure it's solid. The kind of testing you do when you think you've got a piece of gold, but you're not totally sure yet. When you test like this, you aren't trying to hurt anybody. You're trying to find out the truth, so you can move forward. And that is the testing that God encourages when He says, "Put Me to the test" (Malachi 3:10b). That is what He asks us to do when He says, "Taste and see that the Lord is good!" (Psalm 34:8a).

Jesus wants us to test Him in this way—to put our weight on Him, and discover how stable He is. To check what He says and does, and discover that He is the pure, true gold, with no falsehood mixed in. Testing in this way results in a stronger, happier faith—because we see, day after day as we trust Him more and more, that Jesus is indeed telling us the truth. He really does have the power to save us to the uttermost—because He is the One who has died for us and risen again, to be our Savior forever (see Hebrews 7:25). You don't have to fearfully crawl across God's promises, you can go with joy and confidence singing God's praises!

Mission to the Children (MTTC) Mexico 2022- Fall Update

Pastor's Corner Update:

"When the way you have typically done something changes on you, how would you a adapt to it? Mission to the Children (MTTC) has ... had to go through some changes itself. With the passing of Pastor Alejandro Sanchez in 2021, our churches and villages in northern Sonora have been vacant. With the rapid increase of drug cartel violence that is harming bystanders and facing off against the Mexican army, it is next to impossible to have a consistent American presence. These unexpected changes have not helped our efforts to spread the gospel and show God's love in northern Sonora."



"That does not mean that MTTC has given up or taken a break... In-person support has pivoted to remote support as MTTC uses the rural internet infrastructure to equip and encourage the faithful. Consistent American presence was replaced with supply runs and day trips to Sasabe that is within minutes of the border crossing. Action in the local mission field has turned into patience as we fervently pray for the cartel violence to subside and the Lord to provide a permanent pastor to shepherd the vacant flocks.... Though the methods may have changed, MTTC is still focused on spreading the gospel and showing God's love in northern Sonora." -- Pastor Tim Patoka

22nd Annual School Supply Drive



- New signage on the back of the school is now visible from 205 to better promote the school. Members are encouraged to make a special gift for this as well.








