"May I learn to depart from this life as from an inn and not from a home."

Those words have stuck with me ever since I heard them in a prayer. May we see our lives in this world not as being in our home, but as being in a hotel. In other words, when we die, we get to go to our real home in heaven. Believers in the past realized that. "They admitted that they were aliens and strangers on earth... they were longing for a better country--a heavenly one" (Hebrews 11:13,16).



Over the past months, God has certainly been loosening our grip on the things of this world, hasn't he? He's been reminding us that this world isn't really our home. "May I learn to depart from this life as from an inn and not from a home." When you're at a hotel you leave behind the things that belong to the hotel. They are not yours. Those things were there for you to use while you stayed there, but they do not belong to you.

"May I learn to depart from this life as from an inn and not from a home." Many times we become too attached to the things we have in this life. It's important to remember that while the temporary things we become attached to in this world can be great blessings they are not intended to last forever. Yet, it's easy for temporary and eternal things to become blurred.

When Jesus said that you cannot love both God and the things money can buy, and that anyone who loves his family more than Him was not worthy of Him, He was reminding us not to attach ourselves too closely to temporary, worldly things. "May I learn to depart from this life as from an inn and not from a home."

And what a home we have to go to! Heaven is your home. What do imagine it will like? Dream big! After all, he is "able to do immeasurably more than we ever asked or imagined" (Ephesians 3:20) You see, when it comes to your heavenly home it doesn't matter how wide or how high or how deep you set the bar or how great your expectations are... because this much I can guarantee, regardless of what you think heaven will be like it will exceed all your expectations. The awe will be greater than anything you thought possible. And the joy will be more I immense than anything you've ever experienced. 


Attention Parents! In light of current challenges related to classroom gathering, our church is introducing a new approach to Sunday school!

Shoe Drive - Ends this month




I will put hostility between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed. He will crush your head, and you will crush his heel.

Genesis 3:15

Genesis can be broken down into two parts:

- 1. History contains everything from Genesis 1 to 12, or everything until the birth of Father Abraham. The first part includes creation, the Great Flood and the Tower of Babel.
- 2. From Genesis 12 to 50 is the story of the Patriarchs They include Abraham, his son Isaac, and Isaac's son Jacob. Jacob was also the father of Joseph, who is not considered a patriarch but is very important.

These men make up the start of the nation of Israel.

CLAIMS TO FAME: Contains the stories from the birth of Moses through the 40 years of the Exodus.

MOST FAMOUS VERSES:

"You shall have no other gods before me." Exodus 20:3

"God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you."" Exodus 3:14

Important Points about the Book:

- So many exciting Bible stories are found in Exodus! Exodus starts 280 years after the death of Joseph in Egypt with the birth of Moses. Moses was born in 1426 BC. Chapters 1-2 cover events before Moses was called to lead Israel out of Egypt.
- Chapter 3 covers the story of the Burning Bush and Moses' call
- Chapters 7-12 cover the Ten Plagues of Egypt, including the Passover, established with the 10th plague that called for the death of the oldest child of both man and beast.
- Chapters 13 begins the Exodus
- Chapter 20 contains the 10 Commandments.
- The stories are basically over for the remaining 20 chapters, except that chapter 32 contains the story of the Golden Calf. The other chapters contain laws and instructions for the constructing of the first tabernacle. A tabernacle was like a temple, only portable in the desert.
