Psalm 147:4-6 - He determines the number of the stars; He gives to all of them their names. Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; His understanding is beyond measure. The LORD lifts up the humble; He casts the wicked to the ground.

One estimate suggests that there are one septillion stars in the universe. That is a one followed by 24 zeroes. In other words, there are *a* lot of stars. We give names to some stars, like Sirius or Antares. Astronomers document





other stars with letters and numbers, but these are human designations and estimates. God, whose "understanding is beyond measure," created every one of those stars. He "determines the number of the stars; He gives to all of them their names."

Our gracious, all-knowing God pays close attention to details, including numbers and names, and not just for the stars. Scripture sometimes mentions a few of those interesting details and numbers. In those days, five sparrows were sold for two pennies. God does not forget even those little birds, but we are worth so much more to Him than sparrows. He knows the number of hairs on our heads (see Luke 12:6-7). After Jesus' resurrection, Peter and some of the other disciples went fishing and hauled in a net "full of large fish, 153 of them" (John 21:11b). On Pentecost "about three thousand souls" were baptized and added to the church (Acts 2:41b).

God counts souls and stars, fish and sparrows—and sheep. In one of Jesus' parables, a shepherd leaves 99 sheep to find one lost sheep. The story is about Jesus Himself, who came to seek and to save the lost. Names and numbers fill the story of our salvation. Guided by one special star, wise men found the Holy Child named Jesus in Bethlehem. Years later, three crosses were set up at a place called Golgotha. On the center cross Jesus suffered and died to save the lost, to save us all! Then, on the third day after His death, the early light of dawn revealed one empty tomb. Jesus has risen from the dead! On the Last Day when He returns, "all who are in the tombs will hear His voice" (John 5:28b), and through faith in His Name, we will rise to live in His presence forever.

In Baptism, God adopts us as His sons and daughters. The Lord who gives names to the stars names us as His own: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are Mine" (Isaiah 43:1b). One day we will stand before the throne of God in "a great multitude that no one could number" as we cry out in praise to our God and Savior, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" (Revelation 7:9b, 10b). We may not be able to number that multitude, but God can, and He knows every name.


THANK YOU! Many thanks to all those who offered to help Carol Widmann a seated walker this past week. She is enjoying her new mobility!

Wednesdays at 6:00 PM



We are beginning our Confirmation Classes for students who are not able to attend during the week at GLS. This class is especially for 6th - 9th graders but younger students are also welcome to attend.



Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary

Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary (WLS) prepares men to serve in the pastoral ministry by providing them with spiritual, theological, and professional training. Students attend classes for two years, serve as full-time vicars during their third year, and then attend classes and write a thesis in their fourth year. Throughout their time at the seminary, students receive opportunities to serve in a variety of ministries and to experience other cultures to help prepare them for their future calls.

On May 26, 2023, 39 students graduated. The day before, the seminary held its assignment service, where nine of those graduates were assigned to home and world mission fields, including Caleb King (pictured middle in the inset photo), who was assigned to a mission start in North Collin County, Texas. After the service, graduates met with their district presidents and in King's case, with representatives from WELS Home Missions, including Matthew Vogt (pictured right), a mission counselor.

Following graduation, the seminary provides pastors with opportunities for continued growth through its institute, Grow in Grace. Grow in Grace offers continuing education courses, a mentoring initiative for new graduates, a clearinghouse of resources for pastors, and an annual retreat for pastors who are celebrating milestones in their ministries. The mentoring program in particular is a blessing to new graduates. Participation is optional but the program has proven so valuable in recent years that nearly every graduate chooses to have a mentor. Resignation from the ministry has significantly decreased since the mentoring program began in 2010.

MISSION TO THE CHILDREN - UPDATE

Thank you so much for your inquiry about Mission to the Children. As you are aware, at the moment we are unable to enter Sonora as the cartels have taken over the roadways and many of the cities. Your reference is to the people of Sasabe who have all fled the town, many coming to Tucson as the roads south to other parts of Sonora were unsafe.

MttC has located as many of the families who are in our area as we could reach, more than 100 people. Spanish services have begun at Grace Lutheran on a regular basis. While we cannot afford to pay rent for the refugees, we are providing clothing and making sure that no one is without food. Many have been visited in person by MttC Board members and transportation has been provided to events if needed.



MttC held an Epiphany Service in one of our parks where we had begun the outreach to the Tucson Hispanic community, so the refugees and our Tucson contacts were able to also meet each other. God blesses in the most unusual ways!! When we started our first Tucson gathering on Mexican Independence Day, we had no idea what the future held for Sasabe. So when our church members fled from there, we already had plans for a location for the services in the park, saving us much time and attempts to locate a space.

For now we are encouraging prayers for Board members and volunteers who are donating a tremendous amount of time and energy to keep the contacts viable. Also prayers for the congregants of all our Sonoran villages, our one continuing church in Altar and our multiple preaching stations. Their training via Academia Cristo is continuing via electronic contact is my understanding of their current status. We have also recently received a request for a Bibliabus in Cuernavaca and are continuing to pursue that avenue of development.

As to other support, we are asking for continuation of donations of money. Other needs such as food and clothing are available to us via Tucson churches. Postage to mail items has gotten very expensive.


