


January 9, 2022

This week, on January 6th, we observed Epiphany. The celebration of Epiphany reminds us of how God revealed the promise of the Savior to the Magi and led them to come and worship Jesus. It was an "epiphany" because something wondrous had been made known to these Magi... something so wondrous it changed their life. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek word $\varepsilon \pi \varepsilon \phi \alpha \iota v \omega$ (epiphaino) which means "to show", "to bring to light", "to appear", "to become visible" — and when referring to a person it means, "to become clearly known". You might say that an epiphany is an "A-ha!" moment... and there is no greater epiphany



then when the Holy Spirit makes Jesus clearly know to someone. Faith. Epiphanies change everything

While we celebrate the coming of the Magi as Epiphany... that was not the only epiphany recorded for us on the pages of scripture. The same can be said of the apostle Paul. It wasn't as if Jesus became the Son of God and the Savior of the world the day Paul first realized it. That had always been true of Jesus, even when Paul failed to see it and stubbornly worked to snuff out the gospel of Jesus Christ. Jesus was Paul's Savior, whether he believed it or



not. Paul openly acknowledged his former life in darkness under Judaism, how he "was once a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent man" (1 Timothy 1:13) and how he had put many Christians in jail and voted for their execution (Acts 26:10).

And then, one day, Jesus became "clearly known" to Paul. When Jesus himself met Saul (Paul) on the road to Damascus it was an "A-ha" moment! In fact, it blinded him... and not until he was ready to serve God would his sight be restored. Of course, God sent Ananias to heal Saul (Paul) and after he placed his hands on him "something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength. Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus. At once he began to preach in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God. Acts 9:18-20.

One would think that Saul would be the last person on earth Jesus would

be interested in saving. If anyone deserved to suffer forever for his resistance to the saving gospel, it was Saul. Who could possibly be a more unlikely candidate for conversion than someone who was openly attacking Christians, even seeking their extermination?

But Jesus does the unexpected, and Paul marveled at the irony. The apostle also understood the Savior's purpose. **"I** was shown mercy so that in me, the worst of sinners, Christ Jesus might display his immense patience as an example for those who would believe in him and receive eternal life" (1 Timothy 1:16). Paul's conversion proves many things, but it demonstrates one thing above all: Jesus' love and forgiveness extends to every sinner, whether they know it or not, whether they believe it or not. No situation is too hopeless. Epiphanies happen. Epiphanies change everything. For the Magi. For Paul. For us.

Bible History Lessons With Applications From Luther's Catechism Sunday School has started up again. To start we will have a combined class led by Melissa Baker.



Abram Degner (our Nigerian missionary) wishes to thank The Mary Martha Group for the Amazon gift card.


Beginning on Feb. 12, 2022, Mary and Martha will hold

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHTS FOR EPIPHANY 2022

Sunday Isaiah 60:1-3

- **4** This is a spiritual picture. Who is the Light? What does he reflect upon people? V. 1
- Define the glory of the Lord. Jeremiah 2:5-8; Psalm 25:10-12
- Define the "darkness on the earth". What will this light do to the darkness?
- Who will see this great light? From where will those seeing the light come?

Monday 1 Kings 10:1-13

- **What is the message of v. 4? How many will see the light which the Wise men saw?**
- + Think about and discuss these words in v. 5: radiant, heart throb, swell with joy.
- **What is God promising in the last half of verse 5?** Define the "riches". 1 Tim. 6:3-10
- Verse 6 is a prophecy regarding people bringing wealth to the Lord? How should this thought impact us? What does God do with the riches we bring to Him? 1 Kgs.1_1-13

Tuesday Ephesians 1:2-6

- What is meant by the "administration of God's Grace"?
- **What is the mystery made in heaven? How did Paul get to know that mystery?**
- **Why should we understand that Paul and all the prophets had insight into the Word?**
- What are all people to understand through the mystery of the Gospel? How alone do we 'understand" the Gospel?

Wednesday Ephesians 3:7-12

- 4 Originally whose servant was Saul (Paul)? How did Saul become Paul?
- Why did Paul consider himself the least of all of the Apostle? Yet, what did God call him to do?
- With what was Paul entrusted? How does he feel about this? V. 10
- What was God's purpose? Vv. 11-12. Then what does Paul give all credit for what he is? Romans 5:17; 1 Corinthians 15:17.

Thursday Matthew 2:1-6

- Who arrived at Jerusalem soon after Jesus was born? Where did they naturally go to find a King? What sort of King did they find?
- When they asked where the new born the King was, what were they told? What did Herod ask the Wise Men to do when they found the newborn King? What was Herod's real plan?
- **Look** at and discuss the prophecy which foretold where Christ would be born.

Friday Matthew 2:7-12

- What were Herod's final instructions to the Magi What did he plan to do?
- **What appeared to them as they now set out for Bethlehem? How did they receive this?**
- What two things did the Magi do when they found the Baby Jesus?

Saturday All three readings

- What mistake did Herod make which is commonly made today? Mt, 16:15-17
- What is the Key message of Epiphany according to Paul's words to the Ephesians. Also see John 20:21-23. Apply these thoughts to us today.
- Did the Magi set for us a good example for Christian giving? Explain. 2 Corinthians 8:5. Read all of Chapters 8 and 9 to get a good picture of Christian giving.
