

July 18, 2021 Comfort in the midst of conflict: Revelation 20

Revelation chapter 20 introduces the seventh and final vision to the Apostle John. Over the centuries since then, many Christians have been taught to expect a coming millennial (thousand-year) reign of Jesus on earth based, in large part, on the words of this chapter taken out of context from the rest of scripture. That is why it's important that we read these words carefully and compare them to the rest of the bible. A literal interpretation of the bible means we let Scripture interpret itself. A study of other passages that speak about this same subject (Ephesians 1:1-10, John 5:24-30, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18) would indicate that millennialism in any form is not taught anywhere in Scripture and in fact contradicts other portions of the bible.

So what is meant by a thousand-year reign at John sees in his vision? Chapter 20 begins with the dramatization of a historical truth and the ongoing reality that results from it: Jesus, the angel from heaven, has defeated Satan, the

dragon, by his life, death, and resurrection. That good news of Jesus' victory, the gospel, keeps the devil chained up from fully and freely deceiving people and nations with his wicked lies. The dragon will be bound for "a thousand years," a complete number (10 cubed) representing a definite and determined time from Jesus' ascension until shortly before his return in glory. Revelation uses symbolic numbers consistently throughout... 3, 4, 7, 12, 24, 1000, 144,000.

During that same time, we're told that a group of people, those who have taken part in the **"first resurrection,"** reign with Jesus. Who are those people? When we remember the Bible teaching that all human beings are born dead in sin we understand the **"first resurrection"** to be the new birth given by the Holy Spirit through faith when we became alive in Christ (Ephesians 2). Our **"first resurrection"** is when we came to faith in Jesus. Revelation 20 is referring to *all believers in Jesus!* Jesus reigns as King in the hearts of all believers on earth now. As believers, while we take part in the first death, a physical one, we all have eternal life in Christ and need not fear the "second death" (eternal separation from God). Along with all people, we will participate in the second resurrection, a bodily one at Christ's return. In the meanwhile, saints in heaven and on earth live and reign with their living and ruling Savior. That why Jesus taught us to pray, "Thy kingdom come!"

At the end of this period, Satan will be loosed from his chain and allowed to deceive widely and freely. This vision tells us that it will be a "short time" (v. 3). We are reminded of Jesus' words in Matthew 24:21-25, where he speaks of a time of severe testing but promises that he will mercifully cut that time short for the sake of his people. Previous visions in Revelation also point to this time when gospel witness will be nearly silenced. But that short season will come to an end. That end means final judgment for the old evil foe.

That end also means Jesus' return to judge the living and the dead. Those who stand before the judge without the righteousness of Christ by faith are justly sentenced based on their own faulty record. Those who are found in Christ, whose names are written in the book of life, are judged on his perfect life and guilt-removing sacrifice. They have life and peace with God through Christ and need not fear his judgment now or ever. Jesus himself, the victor over sin and Satan, is our life and hope, our comfort in every conflict.

After spending a lovely time in the Cancun area with family and friends, it was time for Sue and me to prepare for the long car drive to Mahahual. We would be visiting the mission and celebrating Día del Niño (Children's day) with the members; I don't think we could have chosen a better Sunday! We purchased a piñata and candy for the children to celebrate this special day.

On Saturday, May 1, we arrived late in the afternoon. We were greeted by Missionary Martin Vallesky, who was busy preparing for the following day. We had brought a large duffle



with 35 backpacks for the smaller children and 15 larger ones for the older kids. We had also purchased craft items, bracelets, cross necklaces, cross door hangers to hand out after the service.

Sue and I set out early Sunday morning to purchase snacks for Bible class and after the service. That morning the driver called in sick, and Meghan had to take his place driving and collecting families, so we were in charge of snacks, juice, and coffee. The kitchen needed a little TLC due to all the ongoing construction, and soon some of the church member women joined us. They seemed so proud of their new kitchen! We introduced ourselves and had a wonderful visit before the service.

Meanwhile, staff members Meghan and Chris were busy filling up their vans, as they picked up member families in time for the service. And soon, the church was full! The service theme honored the children, as Missionary Vallesky delivered a message about the adoption of God's children. Several of the older children did the lesson readings. Meghan's friend Jennifer led the children with the familiar song, "This Little Light of Mine" (Esta Lucecita Mía). At Pastor's request, I had the chance to say a few words about our connection with Martin's family back in Houston and spoke of the gratitude I have for the support of Martin's father, Pastor Vallesky, over the years.

Soon came time for the breaking of the piñatas! Plenty of candy for all! We prepared a light lunch for the children, and there were



lots of happy faces. After the piñatas, we handed out the backpacks. No one left empty-handed!

We stayed to clean up while Meghan and Chris returned the members to their homes. We had plenty of time to tour the impressive new building and to see the adjacent house (it needs lots of work).

We had a lovely time visiting with the staff at Missionary Martin's favorite seafood place, The Big Fish. It was a great opportunity to hear their vision for the ministry and how we can support them. We returned to the US with two projects for our congregation in Portland:

- 1. Shoes/sandals for every child
- 2. Warm clothing for the children for the cold months

What an honor it was to have the opportunity to visit the mission and see how the Lord is working in the lives of these precious souls in Mahahual. We hope to be back soon.
