And by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. Hebrews 10:10

"So what position did you play?" I get asked that question sometimes when people walk into my office and notice the football trophy, cleats, team photo and football lettermen letters on my shelf. Most of the time they don't bother to look at the date on the trophy, the age of the cleats, or the year of the photo. "Yeah," I tease. "I've aged really well since 1962. No, actually, those were my dad's" I say. "He was *really* good." And then the inevitable question comes. "Did you play?" To which I must admit, "Well, I was on the team but I wouldn't call what I did playing... I called my position *"left out"*.



I can joke about it now, but in the moment it was pretty disappointing. No one wants to be "left out". We'd all like to be among the chosen. Being chosen is an important part of being human. Being chosen means you're valuable. When we were kids we all wanted to be chosen when captains were picking teams at recess. No one wanted to be left out. When we were in high school we all wanted to belong and have our crush choose us to ask out. No one wanted to be left out. Even as adults we all hoped to be chosen after that job interview. No one wants to be left out.

In the time of Jesus there was a wall around the temple area in Jerusalem. This wall was there for one reason: to keep out the Gentiles and anyone else who was not allowed to enter the holy places by the laws and customs of Israel. If somebody tried to break through anyway, he was subject to death.

If I had lived in those days, I would have had to stand outside. I would have hated it. To love the Lord and look toward His worship and not be allowed in—how sad and lonely that would be. It would cause a lot of bitterness and anger to left out.

But this is not God's plan for His people. When Jesus came, He said to the Jewish people listening to Him, "I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to My voice. So there will be one flock, one Shepherd" (John 10:16).

Jesus came to lay down His life on the cross to save all people—Jews and Gentiles alike, foreigners and native born. No one is to be left out of His kingdom. He died for us all, and He rose from the dead so that everyone who believes in Him may become children of God—no longer outsiders, but insiders, beloved forever. Citizens of heaven.

We have our own exclusions today. Some people reject others based on class or race or nationality. Others do it based on wealth or education. But Jesus' blood wipes away all this. To Him, all that matters is this: "Are you a person I died for? Do you believe in Me to save you? If so, you are My own." There can be no higher honor, and no greater blessing. We belong to the One who loves us forever—and He didn't leave anyone out... he died once *for all.*
