
The Means of

But his friend was already on his way and as he started out across the sagging cardboard bridge he didn't have the slightest concern about its strength. He had no worries or fears or doubts in fact he was humming a happy song as he boldly stepped onto the flimsy bridge!

At the same time the other friend started on his journey across the big concrete and steel bridge and he was completely *terrified*. His palms began to sweat, his heart was pounding, and there was a tremor in his hands. He couldn't take his eyes off of the fast moving river far below. Thinking it would help to better disperse his weight, he even began to crawl slowly across the steel bridge that was reinforced with concrete.

So, here's the question. Who do you think made it safely to the other side? The person with the strong faith or the person with the weak faith? I think we all know that while the person on the cardboard bridge may have had a strong faith he didn't make it across because his faith was placed in something that was very weak. And while the person with weak faith may have had a lot of worries and doubts and fears we know that he made it across because his faith, even though small, was placed in something that was very strong.

Jesus said, **"If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and** *planted in the sea,' and it will obey you."* You see, faith, no matter how strong it may be, when placed in something that is humanly weak, worldly unreliable or spiritually factious will always result in failure and even death. Yet even the smallest amount faith, when place in the Lord Jesus Christ, it will always result in victory no matter how impossible the circumstance... even death! And why? This past week, Kyle and Noelle Leitzke's bank account was compromised, and their entire life savings, including the proceeds from their recent home sale, totaling approximately \$26,000, were stolen. Due to the nature of the scam, the bank is unable and unwilling to make restitution or compensate the Leitzkes for their loss.

- Pray that God would bless the Leitzkes with courage, patience, trust, and love for the Lord and each other during these difficult days.
- Pray that God would prevent further actions by those who seek to harm and steal from others.
- Offer any wisdom or advice you might have based on your own experiences in overcoming similar issues.
- Send them a card, email, text, or voicemail to encourage them and remind them of God's promises.

And with your actions: We will be setting up a fund at Grace Church to accept financial gifts to help the Leitzkes overcome this loss and restore their savings account. Please consider a generous gift.

We felt it was important for our family of believers to know that someone we love has been hurt and to provide an opportunity for us to show the love of Jesus that fills and overflows into our lives.
