The Means of **Grace**

June 9, 2024

Psalm 119:151 - But You are near, O LORD, and all Your commandments are true.

In the longest chapter in the Bible, there are five short words that ring like a melodious bell in the harsh roar of modern history: "But You are near, O Lord." And in another section of the Bible, in a rarely read chapter, occurs a sentence that hits the target in the bullseye when you're looking for an answer to what's wrong with the modern world.

Ahaz, king of Judah, turned his back on God. Not that he became altogether irreligious, mind you! After all, the king had to worship something. That is, he must believe in something outside of himself. So he did; he turned to idols. The sacred record reports that *"he shut up the*





doors of the house of the LORD," and that "he made high places to make offerings to other gods." Then comes that well-aimed sentence: "But they [the idols] were the ruin of him and of all Israel." When men turned their back on God and begin to love and trust something else more than they love and trust God, the result is always ruinous (see 2 Chronicles 28).

God can be as real to us as He was to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. God can be as true to us as he was to Abram during his pilgrimage from Ur of the Chaldees to the Promised Land. God can be as evident to us as he was to Moses by the burning bush. And God can be as close to us as he was to David when he wrote, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1).

Now I can imagine someone might ask, "How do you know that God is near? Have you seen Him?" The answer is no; I have not seen Him. But I have seen many indications of God's nearness. I see His majesty in the mountains and in the clouds; I see His greatness in the stars and in a drop of water; I see His power in the storm and the tiny atom. But all this is like the flickering of a candle compared with the noonday brightness of His revelation as given in this Bible!

It is there we find God's love. It is in the Scriptures we read of God's Son, Jesus Christ. We read of His life, His obedience to God, and His ministry to us. We read that He took our sins to the cross, died there, was buried, and three days later rose in resurrection victory.

As fallen creatures, our sin keeps us from appreciating God's nearness. Remember it is Christ Himself who says, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with Me" (Revelation 3:20).

It is because of Jesus that we can draw near to God and away from those things that would be as idols in our lives. For each of us, Jesus stands ready, waiting, knocking on the door of our hearts.

May today be the day you hear Him knock on yours.

This past Sunday evening, May 5th, 2024 the Lord of the Church extended a Divine Call to me through the PNW District Mission Board to serve as the first pastor and home missionary in Bend, OR. I am humbled to receive this Call and grateful for the opportunity to consider how my gifts may best serve the kingdom of God by continuing in Portland or going to Bend. Holding these calls provides us all with a unique opportunity to pray for one another and the ministries we carry out. As always, all the leaders, members and friends of Grace Church are welcome to call, email, message, or text me your thoughts. I truly appreciate your input!

Grace Church Financial Update



"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing... If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. – John 15

We are One Together in ministry. Jesus is the Vine and we are the branches and connected to him we will produce much! In fact, connected to Him all things are possible!

The approved budget: Our Grace budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 is set at **\$490,000** which calls for weekly gifts of **\$9423**. Last week's gifts totaled **\$121,510.35** (of which \$110,000 was a special gift.)

Year to date: As of last week, the total amount of gifts we <u>should have</u> reached is **\$452,307**. Praise God, at week 49, the amount in gifts <u>we have received</u> for the Lord's ministry is **\$499,394**.

Currently, due to special gifts, we are \$47,087 ahead of the amount budgeted.

We are grateful for the gifts of love that God's people have brought! This past week in addition to our weekly gifts several members have approached our leadership at Grace and have committed to make gifts to the Lord that will cover the shortfall and address some of our additional expenses! We praise God for moving the hearts of his people to express their love for Christ is such a generous manner!

Weekly Gifts: It's important to note that while our budget shortfall will be covered we still have an approved budget which requires **weekly gifts of \$9423**. We pray that every member at Grace is moved by their love for the Lord to give as generously and faithfully as He has enable each to do. The Apostle Paul encouraged the church with these words "Each one should give as he has determined in his heart, not reluctantly or under pressure, for God loves a cheerful giver. God is able to make all grace overflow to you, so that in all things, at all times, having all that you need, you will overflow in every good work... You will be made rich in every way so that you may be generous in every way, which produces thanksgiving to God through us. (1 Corinthians 9:7-8,11)

Grace Ministry has been blessed with many financial miracles for many years. God is good! We pray that God's children will give generously and joyfully according to His will. We are One Together in ministry.

It's a beautiful hike for everyone. Please bring snacks for the hike and picnic lunch for after.


We will meet at Grace Church at 8:30 AM to carpool or you can come to the trailhead at 10:00 AM (Please don't leave valuables in your car)

To park a NW Forest Pass or National Park Pass is required.


