1 John 5:13-15 - I write these things to you who believe in the Name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life. And this is the confidence that we have toward Him, that if we ask anything according to His will He hears us. And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of Him.

These are some of the most frustrating bits of the Bible to me—the bits where Jesus promises to give us whatever we ask. I'm thinking of phrases like "Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours" (Mark 11:24) and "If you ask Me anything in My Name, I will do it" (John 14:14). Because it sounds like Jesus is making Himself a push-button God—press the right button, and you'll get whatever you want, guaranteed.



So can I do that? Twenty centuries of Christianity says, "No. That's' not the way any of this works." Yes, God is faithful, and yes, He hears our prayers, and yes, He occasionally heals the sick and has even raises the dead when ask! But it's clear that we don't always get what we want. If we did, who would ever get sick or die?

So if that's not what God means, then what does He mean? John gives us the missing clue to this problem: "This is the confidence that we have toward Him, that if we ask anything according to His will He hears us." God is not a fool. He isn't going to hand over the governance of the universe to people like us, who don't know their right hand from their left. And so He commands us to pray for what we want and need—but that extra bit "If it is according to Your will" is always there, whether we say it out loud or not.

So God invites us to ask—but He reserves the final decision to Himself. And that's for our safety, isn't it? We know that whatever we pray for, we cannot cause harm, because God will overrule our mistakes and stupidity. Just this past week a friend reminded me of that when he said, "When God puts a calling on your life or gives you something you asked for, He factored in your stupidity." I found that to be oddly comforting.

And though we can't understand why God allows some things to happen and other things to not happen, we still know that God is in control, and that He loves us—because He gave His Son Jesus to lay down His life for us, to rescue us from evil and bring us back to Himself. And by His rising to life again He broke the power of death over all of us as well, everyone who believes in Him.

So we pray with hope—trusting the God who loves us enough not to give us what we should not have and to give us everything that we need... "according to His will".

I am humbled to receive this Call and grateful for the opportunity to consider how my gifts may best serve the kingdom of God by continuing in Portland or going to Bend. Holding these calls provides us all with a unique opportunity to pray for one another and the ministries we carry out. Grace Church Financial Update



"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing... If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. – John 15

We are One Together in ministry. Jesus is the Vine and we are the branches and connected to him we will produce much! In fact, connected to Him all things are possible!

The approved budget: Our Grace budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 is set at \$490,000 which calls for weekly gifts of \$9423. Last week's gifts totaled \$3,272.00.

Year to date: As of last week, the total amount of gifts we <u>should have</u> reached is **\$414,615**. However, at week 43, the amount in gifts <u>we have received</u> for the Lord's ministry is **\$341,866**.

Shortfall: Currently, there is a gap of \$72,749 between the amount received and the amount budgeted.

We are grateful for the gifts of love that God's people have brought! This past week in addition to our weekly gifts several members have approached our leadership at Grace and have committed to make gifts to the Lord that will cover the shortfall and address some of our additional expenses! We praise God for moving the hearts of his people to express their love for Christ is such a generous manner!

Weekly Gifts: It's important to note that while our budget shortfall will be covered we still have an approved budget which requires weekly gifts of \$9423. We pray that every member at Grace is moved by their love for the Lord to give as generously and faithfully as He has enable each to do. The Apostle Paul encouraged the church with these words "Each one should give as he has determined in his heart, not reluctantly or under pressure, for God loves a cheerful giver. God is able to make all grace overflow to you, so that in all things, at all times, having all that you need, you will overflow in every good work... You will be made rich in every way so that you may be generous in every way, which produces thanksgiving to God through us. (1 Corinthians 9:7-8,11)

Grace Ministry has been blessed with many financial miracles for many years. God is good! We pray that God's children will give generously and joyfully according to His will. We are One Together in ministry.





Earlier this year, Missionary Jorge Briones recommended that 3 cities in the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico be explored to start new churches. Those cities were Chetumal, Cozumel, and Merida. We have been praying for God's guidance in which of these cities would be the best place to plant a new church. Missionary Briones has traveled to these cities, met with fellow Christians in the area, looked at the safety of each city, and tried to determine the potential opportunities a new church would bring to those areas. Pastor Briones wrote about his visit to the city of Merida:

"In March I visited the city of Merida as part of the investigation to find a place to serve our Lord preaching his Word. Merida is one of the largest and safest cities in Mexico. I was able to interview a Korean couple (pictured below) who have lived several years in Merida and whom Pastor Carlos had met. They are Lutherans from a different denomination in Korea. They had been unable to find a Lutheran church in Merida. Though there are many churches, it is not common to find one that teaches healthy doctrine. As we discussed the plans we have to expand mission work, they were enthusiastic and willing to help. We continue to ask the Lord that he would guide us to go and expand his kingdom, producing the fruit he desires for the glory of His name."



While the visit to Merida went well, during a meeting at the end of April, both Missionary Briones and the Costa Maya Ministries Board prayerfully decided that the city of CHETUMAL would be the most fertile ground for starting a new church! Chetumal is the capital of the state Quintana Roo, located about 2 hours from Mahahual. With a growing population of around 300,000 people, the harvest is plentiful! The Briones family will be moving to Chetumal before the beginning of the next school year to begin their work there! Missionary Briones will keep in touch with his contacts in Cozumel and Merida so that in the future, God may bless us with even more opportunities to share the Gospel in those cities! We thank God for these new and exciting opportunities to share his Word with the world. Please continue to keep Missionary Briones and his family in your prayers as they proclaim God's Word in Chetumal!



Legal Status as a Religious Association

Cruz de Cristo Lutheran Church has been meeting as a congregation with a full time pastor since 2015. Now with our permanent church building completed, we are taking the next steps to become recognized by the Mexican government as a "Religious Association" - having the legal standing as a church.

A few months ago, Costa Maya Ministries Board members Juan Garcia and Pastor Dennis Kleist met with Attorney Jose Manuel, a man knowledgeable in this process, to begin navigating the legal course to receiving Religious Association status. This will bring tax benefits and other privileges to our mission similar to those enjoyed by US churches. Equally important, this status will be able to be shared with future new congregations gathered in the Yucatán.

What a blessing this is as Juan Garcia and Pastor Kleist met with Pastor Rosales and missionary Jorge Briones (pictured below) to discuss the exploratory work in Chetumal, Merida, and Cozumell Prayers for God's continued blessings on our mission are greatly appreciated!

Mission to the Children (MttC) April 23, 2024 email from John Kramer

Just to keep you abreast of the situation with cartel violence in Sonora (Mexico) where Mission to the Children works, I'm sharing a short update. The cartels are



continuing the fight for US market share in the human trafficking and drug trade, a multibillion-dollar enterprise. The poor are the ones who suffer most. In Atil, about an hour south of the border where the mission has a house and chapel, a neighbor's house was set on fire this morning as punishment for some unknown wrong. Little about the situation in Sonora is making the news so I'm sharing a first-hand report written this morning from a person in a village near Atil that I've copied and pasted below."

"The people are not allowed to leave the villages they live in and if they are found with information about the local situation on their phones, they are severely punished. Spot checks of people's phones by armed men are common. The situation hasn't improved since last November, although no reports are surfacing of active gun battles at present. Yes, John, here the war has not ended, but we continue praying and more and more not to lose faith and that help will come from heaven. There are many sick people with stress and tension illnesses due to the situation and little work and so many things are going badly. I only ask you to communicate with the others that they will once again continue the same mission (in Sonora, Mexico) that they have in the past (once the present war is over), and we thank you for continuing praying and looking out for us, we are all family."

Pacific Northwest District Convention – June 4th & 5th

Location: Evergreen Lutheran High School at 7306 Waller Road East, Tacoma, WA 98443.

Presentation / Theme — Rejoice! The Christian's Battle Cry. Prof. Joel Russow of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary will present on three areas of strengthening relationships and extending Christlike love to lonely and hurting hearts. "In this world you will have trouble." We live in a world of death, mourning, crying, and pain. The bruising troubles of this life and the heavy barrage of the devil's attacks leave hearts, relationships, and homes lonely and hurting. But Jesus also said, "Take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

Lay Delegate Attendance and Credentials — "Each congregation of the district shall be represented by a lay delegate, who shall be certified to the secretary of the district by his congregation" At this biennial convention each congregation seats one male lay delegate to represent your church and to vote. For that reason we ask that you would provide your delegate the proper materials and the credentials (Online Delegate Form) from the congregation they represent.

District Dues — Since "all expenses of the district convention... shall be paid by the membership of the district" your dues help cover convention expenses and provide modest travel equalization subsidy for those serving in the outer regions of our large district, as well as provide counseling for our called workers in the PNW.

Report to the Twelve Districts - Each congregation will receive one printed copy of the report by late May. A full electronic version will be available online in the first week of May. Please review the online material before the convention, so you are informed on discussions that may take place at the convention. Additionally, Floor Committees are being assembled to divide up the RTTD for summary and celebration at the convention.

Elections – Positions on the presidium and within the district be elected at this convention. This year, we have the privilege of electing our next District President following President Steinbrenner's move to Wisconsin.

FINANCIAL SERVICES

Financial Services provides finance and accounting services that support WELS ministries and safeguard the assets that God has provided.


"WELS is in a very strong financial position as we enter the fiscal year 2023–24 and 2024–25 biennium," notes Mr. Kyle Egan, WELS' chief financial officer and treasurer. "It is with joyful thanks to our gracious Lord that the synod has continued to see strong levels of unrestricted support through gifts, grants, and bequests, which allows for the continued expansion of mission and ministry. We ask God to provide pure hearts, clear vision, and patient faith as the plans for this biennium are carried out."


Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO) are critical to WELS' financial position as they fund approximately 70 percent of WELS' operating budget every year. WELS finished fiscal year 2023 (year ended June 30, 2023) with CMO of \$23.4 million, which was 1.3 percent higher than the previous year. WELS is thankful for the continued generosity of its people in supporting ministry efforts.

Other critical components to WELS' financial position are strong reserves, including the Financial Stabilization Fund, which is utilized every year to support approximately 30 percent of WELS' operating budget. The Financial Stabilization Fund holds all undesignated non-CMO funding sources (gifts, grants, bequests, investment income, and other support) to assist in supporting the synod's annual operating expenses.

Synod convention delegates passed the proposed fiscal year 2023–24 and 2024–25 ministry financial plan in July 2023, which includes support for WELS ministerial education, home and world missions, congregation and district ministry, and general ministry. Total synod expenses (including the four ministerial education schools) for the biennium are expected be approximately \$90 million each year supported by synod

operating support consisting of CMO and the Financial Stabilization Fund (approximately 35 percent) as well as tuition, reserves, individual gifts, and grants (approximately 65 percent).





WELS BENEFIT PLANS

The WELS Benefit Plans Office (BPO) serves WELS and Evangelical Lutheran Synod workers and organizations through administration of the WELS Voluntary Employees' Beneficiary Association (VEBA) Health Plan, the WELS Pension Plan, and the WELS Shepherd Plan.

The WELS VEBA Health Plan provides benefits for church and school workers and their family members in accordance with God's Word while remaining compliant with applicable law. The VEBA Plan provides comprehensive, nationwide coverage. More than 80 percent of WELS workers and calling bodies participate in WELS VEBA.

The WELS Shepherd Plan is the retirement savings plan for synod workers. WELS called workers earn retirement benefits through defined contributions made to their Shepherd Plan accounts. In addition, workers can save and invest a portion of their earnings and calling bodies can make employer contributions to provide income to workers during their retirement years.

The WELS Pension Plan provides WELS called workers with a valuable source of guaranteed income during retirement. The Pension Plan was frozen on Dec. 31, 2021. All Pension benefits earned through the freeze date will be paid to participants but no new Pension benefits can be earned for service performed after the freeze date.

Coverage and benefits provided through WELS Benefit Plans are uniform throughout all 50 states. This supports WELS ministry and the call process by providing access to high-quality, affordable benefits for workers and calling bodies regardless of geographic location.
