The Means of Grace March 12, 2023



Exodus 24:12-18 - The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to Me on the mountain a nd wait there, that I may give you the tablets of stone, with the Law and the Commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses rose with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. And he said to the elders, "Wait here for us until we return to you. And behold, Aaron and Hur are with you. Whoever has a dispute, let him go to them." Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of the LORD dwelt on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it six days. And on the



seventh day He called to Moses out of the midst of the cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud and went up on the mountain. And Moses was on the mountain 40 days and 40 nights.

It's hard to imagine what this experience would have been like for Moses. All through the book of Exodus, it's plain to see how God had His hand in the events in Moses' life. His narrow escape as an infant from the murderous intention of an anxious king and then again when he was being hunted for having killed an Egyptian, God was priming him for a major role in the history of the children of Israel.

By the time he was ascending Mount Sinai, Moses had already led a remarkably full life. After taking refuge in Midian and encountering God in a burning bush there, he returned to Egypt. There he met with Pharaoh and declared on God's behalf: "Let My people go, that they may hold a feast to Me in the wilderness" (Exodus 5:1b). But Pharaoh wouldn't hear of it, and fierce plagues sent by God were soon let loose.

Even before arriving at Mount Sinai, Moses was integral to God's unfolding plan of redemption. He witnessed the first Passover, Israel's exodus east from Pharaoh's army, and the destruction of Egyptians in hot pursuit at the Red Sea. But it was at Mount Sinai where Moses must have felt he experienced God's greatest intervention: the giving of the Ten Commandments. These, now, inscribed on stone, were words to live by—words to guide God's people on their way to the Promised Land.

And immediately—in no uncertain terms—the Commandments prompted the people's response to the God who saved them. We, like them, are sinners: lost, and broken beyond repair. Here then, in this moment of grand disclosure, is Moses in his greatest role yet: the law-giver who points to Jesus: the Life-Giver.

We don't stand a chance keeping God's Law. It condemns our sin utterly. But Jesus, God's only Son, took the Law's full penalty for our sins. He fulfilled the Law, and through faith in Him as Savior gives us His victory.

"And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This He set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in Him (Colossians 2:13-15).

Don Stoffer who had carpal tunnel surgery this past week. May God grant quick healing!



The Elders shall assist the pastor in caring for members and coordinating ministries to encourage our members in nurturing their faith in Worship, Christian Education, In reach, Outreach, and Stewardship.

- Every Member Visit (EMV): The Board of Elders are assisting Pastor Bitter in beginning an EMV. Our initial plan to schedule 4 EMV days a month alternating Tuesdays and Thursdays each week as it works in coordination with Pastor's schedule. In the first phase, members will sign up for a 30 minute visits. In the second phase, members who did not sign up will be contacted to schedule a visit. In the third phase, home visits will be requested for members who have been unable/unwilling to participate. As they are available one of our 4 Elders will try attend some of the visits. Some members would like to meet with Pastor privately. Our goal is to assist members in identifying gifts and encouraging everyone to worship and serve the Lord in our ministry together at Grace. A predetermined short survey and spreadsheet to be used during the EMV will help us accomplish this goal. While this is an important part of our ministry, the Elders would remind the council and leadership that it is a significant commitment of time to carry out an EMV and can take up to a year to accomplish.
- Care for Called Workers (CCW): The Elders have established the framework for the CCW and are finalizing its implementation. While helpful, information / programs from the synod was designed for very large congregations. Much of information needed to be "paired down" in order to fit our needs. Thanks to Josh Luplow for his work on this. Currently 4 women and 3 men have agreed to serve or are prayerfully considering. In the past, the CCW has served Grace as a resource and conduit for our workers to get support & encouragement and express needs and concerns. In the past 3 years' former committee members have moved and the CCW has needed to be rebuilt following COVID. Initial plans are to gather committee members, train and discuss our plans for this ministry and fully implement in the spring.
- **Sunday School:** Attendance and participation in Sunday School has been growing. Regular visitor and prospect children have also started participating with a high mark of 22 children in attendance on February 19th... a 633% growth from our average of 3 last year! Committed teachers, volunteers, leaders and changing to after worship has been blessed by God. Sunday School children participated in children's devotions during Advent, our Christmas Day Service and are currently preparing for Palm Sunday and Easter.

- **Bible Studies:** The Elders believe that it is important to offer Grace Members as many opportunities as possible to be in the Word together. In addition to our ongoing regular bible studies on Sundays and Wednesdays we will also be adding a monthly opportunity called "Healthy Marriage" for our married couples and those planning to get married. While Lent is a difficult time to begin another bible study we feel that it is a critical time to focus on marriage and it is our goal to begin offering this class on the last Saturday in March, the 25th. Additionally, we have added a monthly Saturday men's bible study "Forged" as a companion to our monthly women's bible study at Mary & Martha. Also offered weekly at Grace are regular confirmation classes, BIC classes, and Christian Family counseling at Grace church and school.
- **Fellowship:** The Elders are trying to offer opportunities to every age group to gather for Christian fellowship. *ROOTED* offers opportunity for our 20 30 somethings. (Grace will be reassuming this group since the circuit has not been able to meet with success.) *CrossOver Basketball* offers opportunities to pay at Grace School on Sunday and Mondays. (Ben & Aaron Baker). *Mary & Martha* offer women of Grace opportunities to meet and serve. (Sara Hehr, Linda Bern, Sue Lewallen). And, we are pleased to announce that a youth group for *Grace Kids* has been started. (On February 10th The Great Cookie Scarf took place. 8 youth were present led by Stephanie Delgado and Gabby Baker.) Grace also continues to offer Youth Lutheran Bible Camp and Ypouth Soccer Camp in the summer.
- Worship: The Elders in conjunction with our worship committee are planning Wednesday Lenten dinner and devotions under the theme "Songs of Lent" and we are following a Sunday Lenten theme of "In His Final Steps". Continuing to encourage our members to make worship an important part of every week will also be part of our ongoing EMV. We continue to serve many souls each Sunday in state and out of state and around the world via our FB Live stream that cannot attend in person. We are averaging 80-90 on a Sunday in person and 30-40 online. Many thanks to Aaron Baker for continuing to build our Ushers group.
- Shut in Visits: The Elders continue to ensure that our elderly and shut in are visited. Shirley Baker, Dorothy Elsasser, Cheri Lockhart, Edna Krieder, Michael Lewallen, Avilla Rehbein are currently shut in. Pastor Bitter also has had opportunity to visit those in hospice who are friends of Grace. Many thanks to Randy & Darlene Jensen for making sure our shut in member are visited on a weekly basis!


Sunday Confirmation Class at 8:00 AM

Please let Pastor Bitter know if you'd be interested in attending or helping organize!




Couples Class – Coming Soon

Please look for more information and opportunities to sign up in the coming weeks!




Please plan on joining us after worship on Sundays for Bible Class and Sunday for every age!
