


November 15, 2020



The two books of Samuel tell the story of this great leader who anointed the first two kings of Israel, Saul and David.

FAMOUS STORIES INCLUDED:

- Samuel's mother gives him to the priests to raise.
- Samuel hears God's voice as a boy.
- Samuel anoints David as future king.
- David kills Goliath.

 Saul calls on a witch to bring the prophet Samuel back to life and speak to him.

MOST FAMOUS VERSES:

The LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at how tall he is, because I have rejected him. For the LORD does not look at things the way man does. For man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." 1 Sam. 16:7

Then David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD of Armies, the God of the ranks of Israel, whom you have defied. 1 Sam. 17:45

Important Points about the Book:

- 1 Samuel contains the stories of Samuel the prophet, King Saul, and King David's trials before he was king.
- Prior to Samuel, the people of Israel had been in tribes, held loosely together. But God transformed them
 into a unified nation under one form of government in this part of their history. First Samuel focuses on
 the establishment of Israel as a nation.
- The people demanded a king because all the surrounding nations had one, and they were giving in to peer pressure.
- The first king was Saul, and the second king was David. This book covers mostly the prophet Samuel
 growing up, King Saul's good and bad adventures, and his chasing down David to try to kill him. The
 book ends with the death of Saul.

located on the Check In table as you enter church and will be available through Nov. 25.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from the Pacific Northwest! This past Sunday afternoon, October 18th, the Lord of the Church extended a Divine Call to me through your congregation to serve as the Outreach Pastor for St. John Lutheran Church in Sparta, WI. I am humbled to receive your Call and grateful for the opportunity to consider how my gifts may best serve the kingdom of God in Sparta!

I look forward to speaking with your leaders and I would welcome the opportunity to speak with anyone from St. John who would like contact me. My contact information is below – call, email, text. In addition, I will be speaking with the leaders and members of Grace, here in Portland, Oregon where I am currently serving.

As I prayerfully consider where to serve the Lord, I ask that you please keep me and my family in your prayers, as well as God's people here in Portland, OR. Please be assured that St. John Church & School are in my prayers and in the prayers of the members of Grace as well.

As with many of our pastors, I grew up in the Midwest (Oakfield, Wisconsin) and served at Grace, Le Sueur, MN for the first 8 years of my ministry. However, over the past 16 years I have become very familiar with life on the West Coast and living in a large urban city like Portland. Obviously, Portland and Sparta have many differences... and at the same time some similarities. In the city, I love the multicultural opportunities that are all around us. I love the world mission field that exists in every neighborhood. Life in this city forces me to think about what it means to be a Christian as I come into daily contact with people who don't look, think, or believe like I do. Yet, when I think of each of them as a precious soul to be won for Jesus, I have to leave behind whatever attitudes I might have about people who aren't like me and see them for who they are, blood bought souls who God loved so much he sent his Son to save! On a daily basis the city, (be it Portland or Sparta) forces me to think about the question posed to Jonah "Should I not be concerned about that great city?"

At Grace in Portland I have many responsibilities. As a pastor at Grace Church we care for about 300 souls of our members each day. At our school I assist with the responsibilities for 120 students Preschool – 8th grade and teach confirmation classes to 5-8 graders. In our district I serve as the Circuit Pastor for Oregon. I also have served as the spiritual advisor for the PNW WELS Kingdom Workers RMT. All this work brings me great joy!

In addition to the ministry at Grace I'm also a husband and a father. I've serve as a pastor for the past 24 years and for the past 27 years God has bless me with a loving a supportive wife, Kimberly, and 5 children who bring joy into our lives every day. Our oldest son, Tyler, is 25 and lives close to Portland and works in construction and window installation. Our oldest daughter, Mikayla, is 24 and is recently married and moved to Arkansas where she works as a veterinary tech/supervisor. Our middle son, Noah, is 22 and lives and works close to Portland and exploring career opportunities in power management and aviation. Our youngest son, Josiah, is 19 and lives at home and works close to Portland and is planning to attend community college while exploring career opportunities in power management and aviation. And our youngest daughter, Rebekah, is 14 and is a Freshman in high school in Gladstone, Oregon.

I wanted to share a little information with you about my family as I acknowledge this call because that dynamic also plays a large part in deliberating a call. We all ask that you would lift us up in your prayers over the next few weeks. I am confident that the Lord will lead me to a decision that will be a blessing to his kingdom and will, above all, bring him glory.

Thank you for the trust you have placed in me by extending to me this Divine Call. May our gracious Lord continue to richly bless you as we serve him day by day.
