Fourteen teachings that define being Lutheran:

6. You are the Church – believers in Jesus

What is the church supposed to look like? In Luther's days, there were differing views about what the church looked like. The Roman Catholic Church considered the one holy church to be the church of Rome. Others, sought a church that was pure in members and ministers. They tried to create a perfect church and community where God's law reigned supreme and everyone was living holy lives. Both views emphasized the outward nature of the church.

Luther went back to Scripture. Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36). The one holy church is not a visible organization. Instead, the church is made up of people who believe in Jesus (1 Corinthians 1:2)... the "invisible church". Therefore, God only knows members of



the holy Christian church because only God can see faith in a person's heart (2 Timothy 2:19). We know where the church is because believers gather around the Word and sacraments, but in these visible congregations there will always be hypocrites (Matthew 13:24-30,36-43).

The church always will be under attack from false teachings and worldly influences (Matthew 7:15; 2 Timothy 3:1-5). But the church will endure because the Word of God will endure (1 Peter 1:23-25). We have God's promise that when the Word is proclaimed, he is at work to accomplish his purposes (Isaiah 55:10,11). That is why the church gathers around the Word and sacraments and uses the Word and sacraments. Jesus promised his presence when believers gather in his name (Matthew 18:20). The Spirit is at work through the gospel of Jesus, bringing unbelievers to faith and strengthening the faith of believers (Romans 10:17; 2 Thessalonians 2:13,14; John 3:5,6; Titus 3:5).

When we see believers and the gospel under attack, we can wonder if God is still at work and if the church will endure. But we find comfort in God's promise to preserve and bless his little flock (John 10:27-30; Luke 12:32). Instead of getting envious about larger church organizations, we endeavor to faithfully do the work Jesus has given his church to do. Believers simply proclaim the gospel and administer the sacraments (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:15).

Luther summarized this well when he confessed in the Smalcald Articles, "We do not concede to them that they are the church, and frankly they are not the church. We do not want to hear what they command or forbid in the name of the church, because, God be praised, a seven-year-old child knows what the church is: holy believers and 'the little sheep who hear the voice of their shepherd.' This is why children pray in this way, 'I believe in one holy Christian church.' . . . Its holiness exists in the Word of God and true faith" (Part III, Article XII).

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from the Pacific Northwest! This past Monday evening, November 8th, the Lord of the Church extended a Divine Call to me through your congregation to serve as the pastor at Christ Our Savior in Collinsville. I am humbled to receive your Call and grateful for the opportunity to consider how my gifts may best serve the kingdom of God in the Collinsville area.

I look forward to speaking with your leaders and I would welcome the opportunity to speak with anyone from Christ Our Savior or Martin Luther who would like contact me. My contact information is below – call, email, text. In addition, I will be speaking with the leaders and members of Grace, here in Portland, Oregon where I am currently serving.

As I prayerfully consider where to serve the Lord, I ask that you please keep me and my family in your prayers, as well as God's people here in Portland, OR. Please be assured that Christ Our Savior and the ministry at Martin Luther will be in my prayers and in the prayers of the members of Grace as well.

As with many of our pastors, I grew up in the Midwest (Oakfield, Wisconsin) and served at Grace, LeSueur, MN for the first 8 years of my ministry. However, over the past 17 years I have become very familiar with life on the West Coast and living in a large urban city like Portland. Portland and Collinsville / Saint Louis have many differences... and many similarities.

In the city, I love the multi-cultural opportunities that are all around us. I love the world mission field that exists in every neighborhood. Life in this city forces me to think about what it means to be a Christian as I come into daily contact with people who don't look, think, or believe like I do. Yet, when I think of each of them as a precious soul to be won for Jesus, I have to leave behind whatever attitudes I might have about people who aren't like me and see them for who they are, blood bought souls who God loved so much he sent his Son to save! On a daily basis the city forces me to think about the question posed to Jonah "Should I not be concerned about that great city?"

At Grace in Portland I have many responsibilities. As a pastor at Grace Church we care for about 260 souls of our members each day. At our school I serve as the campus pastor for about 120 students Preschool – 8th grade and teach religion and confirmation classes to the 5th – 8th grades. In our district I also serve as the Circuit Pastor for Oregon. All this work brings me great joy!

In addition to the ministry at Grace I'm also a husband and a father. I've serve as a pastor for the past 25 years and for the past 28 years God has bless me with a loving a supportive wife, Kimberly, and 5 children who bring joy into our lives every day. Our oldest son, Tyler, is 26 and lives and works close to Portland. Our oldest daughter, Mikayla, is 25, married, and works as a relator in Little Rock, Arkansas. Our middle son, Noah, is 23, and our youngest son, Josiah, is 20. Both are living at home and working in Portland while studying power management and taking online classes at Bismarck University. Finally, our youngest daughter, Rebekah, is 15 and is a sophomore at Gladstone High School near Portland.

I wanted to share a little information with you about my family as I acknowledge this call because that dynamic also plays a large part in deliberating a call. We ask that you would lift us up in your prayers over the next few weeks. I am confident that the Lord will lead me to a decision that will be a blessing to his kingdom and will, above all, bring him glory.

Thank you for the trust you have placed in me by extending to me this Divine Call. May our gracious Lord continue to richly bless us as we serve him day by day.

Haggai is the tenth of the Minor Prophets, the last 12 books of the Old Testament. When Most of the Minor Prophets wrote about the coming destruction of Judah, Israel, or the surrounding nations, but Haggai is different. Like Zechariah and Malachi, Haggai shows up on the scene long after the destruction took place.

Old Testament: 39 Books



New Testament: 27 Books

Haggai blends history and prophecy like no other Minor Prophet. Most of these books are collections of discourses and visions, but Haggai mixes short messages from God with the way people respond to them.

FAMOUS STORIES INCLUDED:

After spending 70 years as captives in Babylon, the Jews were allowed to return to Jerusalem. The Persian emperor Cyrus issued a decree: the Jews were to rebuild the temple of the Lord. Zerubbabel, who was of the royal line of David, led the Jews back home.

MOST FAMOUS VERSES:

Now this is what the LORD Almighty says: "Give careful thought to your ways. "You have planted much, but harvested little. You eat, but never have enough. You drink, but never have your fill. You put on clothes, but are not warm. You earn wages, only to put them in a purse with holes in it." - Haggai 1:5-6

Important Points about the Book:

- Haggai wrote from Jerusalem when many people had returned from the Babylonian exile. Those who had returned in hope 15 years earlier were now facing dire struggles. They lacked clothing and food and had been mocked by other nations brutally about rebuilding their temple. The mocking had drained them of faith so that they had quit.
- Haggal's messages are simple and straightforward. God tells the people through Haggal to rebuild the temple first.
 It would keep them from falling back into errors that had caused the Great Exile.
- The book is only two chapters and focuses specifically on getting the returnees to build the temple as top priority. Such would bring unity, faith, and strength back to them.


Sunday School has started up again. To start we will have a combined class led by Melissa Baker.


Sunday School will meet in the room at the far end of the fellowship hall from 8:30 – 9:15 AM on Sunday mornings. Adult and older children are welcome to






