Fourteen teachings that define being Lutheran: 7. Two kingdoms – Sacred and Secular

There has always been tension between the church and government. At various times and places in history, the government has tried to wipe out the church. At other times, the government has tried to use the church for its purposes. Eventually, the church started carrying out a governmental role and even tried to bend the government to its will, attempting to use the government to carry out the church's work. Popes crowned emperors. Kings vowed to defend the church. Popes and bishops ruled territory and led armies. Conflicts arose over who should appoint church leaders: the church or the government. The result was confusion between the church's work and the government's work.

Sacred A TALE OF TWO KINGDOMS Secular

Martin Luther and his fellow reformers went back to the Scriptures to sort out this confusion. God carries out his work for the benefit of his believers and for the good of his whole creation in two different kingdoms or realms.

On the one hand, God has established his church, and through the church's work he cares for our souls (Matthew 16:17-19; Hebrews 13:7,17; Acts 20:28; 1 Timothy 4:15). He brings people to faith through the Word and sacraments (Romans 1:16; Romans 10:17; 1 Peter 1:23; Titus 3:5; Ephesians 5:25-27). He strengthens his church and comforts his people through the work he has given the church to do (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:46-48; 2 Corth. 5:19-21).

On the other hand, God has established government, and through the government's work he cares for our bodies (1 Peter 2:13,14; Romans 13:1,2). He maintains peace and order in society through laws; he protects people's physical well-being through the enforcement of laws (Romans 13:3-7).

True Lutherans have historically tried to avoid using governmental force to further the cause of the gospel, while also recognizing that Christians may serve in the government and be served by the government. True Lutherans have also attempted to avoid the confusion of the two kingdoms. The church and the government each have their own distinct mission and distinct ways to carry out that mission. As God's children, we live in both kingdoms and strive to be obedient servants in the church and to the government.

The Augsburg Confession stated it well:

"Now inasmuch as the power of the church... bestows eternal benefits and is used and exercised only through the office of preaching, it does not interfere at all with public order and secular authority. For secular authority deals with matters altogether different from the gospel. Secular power does not protect the soul but, using the sword and physical penalties, it protects the body and goods against external violence.

That is why one should not mix or confuse the two authorities, the spiritual and the secular. For spiritual power has its command to preach the gospel and to administer the sacraments.... It should not annul or disrupt secular law and obedience to political authority. It should not make or prescribe laws for the secular power concerning secular affairs... In this way our people distinguish the offices of the two authorities and powers and direct that both be honored as the highest gifts of God on earth." (XXVIII:10-13,18)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from the Pacific Northwest! This past Monday evening, November 8th, the Lord of the Church extended a Divine Call to me through your congregation to serve as the pastor at Christ Our Savior in Collinsville. I am humbled to receive your Call and grateful for the opportunity to consider how my gifts may best serve the kingdom of God in the Collinsville area.

I look forward to speaking with your leaders and I would welcome the opportunity to speak with anyone from Christ Our Savior or Martin Luther who would like contact me. My contact information is below – call, email, text. In addition, I will be speaking with the leaders and members of Grace, here in Portland, Oregon where I am currently serving.

As I prayerfully consider where to serve the Lord, I ask that you please keep me and my family in your prayers, as well as God's people here in Portland, OR. Please be assured that Christ Our Savior and the ministry at Martin Luther will be in my prayers and in the prayers of the members of Grace as well.

As with many of our pastors, I grew up in the Midwest (Oakfield, Wisconsin) and served at Grace, LeSueur, MN for the first 8 years of my ministry. However, over the past 17 years I have become very familiar with life on the West Coast and living in a large urban city like Portland. Portland and Collinsville / Saint Louis have many differences... and many similarities.

In the city, I love the multi-cultural opportunities that are all around us. I love the world mission field that exists in every neighborhood. Life in this city forces me to think about what it means to be a Christian as I come into daily contact with people who don't look, think, or believe like I do. Yet, when I think of each of them as a precious soul to be won for Jesus, I have to leave behind whatever attitudes I might have about people who aren't like me and see them for who they are, blood bought souls who God loved so much he sent his Son to save! On a daily basis the city forces me to think about the question posed to Jonah "Should I not be concerned about that great city?"

At Grace in Portland I have many responsibilities. As a pastor at Grace Church we care for about 260 souls of our members each day. At our school I serve as the campus pastor for about 120 students Preschool – 8th grade and teach religion and confirmation classes to the 5th – 8th grades. In our district I also serve as the Circuit Pastor for Oregon. All this work brings me great joy!

In addition to the ministry at Grace I'm also a husband and a father. I've serve as a pastor for the past 25 years and for the past 28 years God has bless me with a loving a supportive wife, Kimberly, and 5 children who bring joy into our lives every day. Our oldest son, Tyler, is 26 and lives and works close to Portland. Our oldest daughter, Mikayla, is 25, married, and works as a relator in Little Rock, Arkansas. Our middle son, Noah, is 23, and our youngest son, Josiah, is 20. Both are living at home and working in Portland while studying power management and taking online classes at Bismarck University. Finally, our youngest daughter, Rebekah, is 15 and is a sophomore at Gladstone High School near Portland.

I wanted to share a little information with you about my family as I acknowledge this call because that dynamic also plays a large part in deliberating a call. We ask that you would lift us up in your prayers over the next few weeks. I am confident that the Lord will lead me to a decision that will be a blessing to his kingdom and will, above all, bring him glory.

Thank you for the trust you have placed in me by extending to me this Divine Call. May our gracious Lord continue to richly bless us as we serve him day by day.

Zechariah's writings encourage and admonish the Jews of Jerusalem. But most importantly, he anticipates a full restoration of God and His people.

Old Testament: 39 Books

New Testament: 27 Books

After the Babylonian captivity the Jews had been released to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple of the Lord. The city is in ruins. The royal family has been reduced to governor status. The temple is under construction. But the words of the prophets still remain.

FAMOUS STORIES INCLUDED:

Zechariah uses different ways to communicate God's word: Visions. Zechariah has vivid visions, Lucky for Zechariah and us!—an angel interprets many of these symbols. The word of the Lord. This is God using Zechariah as His mouthpiece to the people through word alone. Symbolic demonstrations. Sometimes, Zechariah will do something in the physical world that represents the spiritual side of things.

MOST FAMOUS VERSES:

Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. **Zechariah 9:9**

"And I will pour out on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem a spirit of grace and supplication. They will look on me, the one they have pierced, and they will mourn for him as one mourns for an only child, and grieve bitterly for him as one grieves for a firstborn son." **Zechariah 12:10**

Important Points about the Book:

- We often look for a chronological order when reading Bible prophecy, and that's one of the things that can make it confusing. Zechariah does things like refer to Jesus' first coming in Zechariah 9:9 (see above), which references Palm Sunday. Then in the very next verses, he refers to the Second Coming.
- Zechariah is quick to show us that God clearly sees a big picture. He sees what is coming as clearly as what is past. He is likely to cause prophecy that will mention the details of that big picture together, even though they may happen thousands of years apart.
- Zechariah's first eight chapters are directed to the builders of the Second Temple and the returnees from the Babylonian exile. He prophesies at the same time as Haggai, but while Haggai's messages were full of caution, Zechariah's are full of hope and encouragement.
- Chapters 9-14 are thought to have been given much later in his life. They refer mostly to the coming of the Messiah, both his life and death and his future return.
