Germany. 1936. Adolph Hitler is rising to the pinnacle of his power. The masses who follow him feed his egomaniacal hunger for glory and power. Many are caught up in the frenzy of the masses... it's hard to do what's right when you're in a crowd that says otherwise. That's the very definition of oppression. That is why this may be one of the greatest pictures ever taken.

The photo was taken in Hamburg at the launch of a German warship which Hitler himself was present for. Do you see why this is such a fantastic photo? In the crowd one man refuses to raise his arm to give the Nazi salute. The man's name was August Landmesser. I don't really know anything about him except what this picture tells me about him...





and just based on that I wish I could be more like August Landmesser. It was by pure chance that one of this children recognized their father when this long lost photo was published in a German newspaper in 1991. How proud his children must have been! Their father had stood up for what was right in the face of what he knew was wrong. Be this guy!

Oppression is evil. Listen to Solomon's stark assessment of our world: "Again I looked and saw all the oppression that was taking place under the sun: I saw the tears of the oppressed—and they have no comforter; power was on the side of their oppressors—and they have no comforter. And I declared that the dead, who had already died, are happier than the living, who are still alive. But better than both is he who has not yet been, who has not seen the evil that is done under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 4:1-3).

What sad, powerful words! Aren't they true? How many people are crying with no comforter? The answer to oppression isn't as simple as more education or better opportunities or changes in laws. We need even more. We need someone to change hearts. To dry tears. Who can do that? I'll give you a hint, it's not any political leader.

Only Jesus. As we see and address the oppression in our world, may God's Word draw us all closer to Jesus. There is only One who dries tears. There is only One who speaks truth to power. In fact, only One who has all power to one day make everything right. There is only One who brings the dead to life. Only One who died for every evil under the sun. Only Jesus. Oppression is real. It is evil. But we're not alone. We're not without a comforter. In fact, we have a conqueror. We have Jesus and only Jesus!


