

The Means of Grace

September 1, 2024

"And now, O Israel, listen ... Only take care, and keep your soul diligently, lest you forget the things that your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life. Make them known to your children and your children's children - Deuteronomy 4:1a, 9

I have a friend who, on the day his son was born, began a tradition of reading a chapter from the Bible each night before family prayers. It might sound trivial—what can a newborn understand of the stories we read? But we adults remembered, and over the years, as his son grew up, he continued the practice. Now that young man knows the Lord and is growing in his faith as an adult.

There is nothing more important than passing on the Christian faith to our children and grandchildren. If you trust in Jesus and know what He has done for you—how He is your life, hope, and salvation—what can you do to pass that blessing on to your family?

Moses faced a similar question in his final speech recorded in Deuteronomy. Knowing that he was about to die and that Israel would need to pass on their faith to future generations, he appealed to their experiences since leaving Egypt. He reminded them of the Lord's deeds—the rescue from slavery, the parting of the Red Sea to escape the Egyptian army, the provision of manna and water in the barren wilderness, and protection from their enemies (see Deuteronomy 11, 8, and 23:4-5). Moses summarized it this way: they needed to remember all the good things the Lord had done for them, trust in Him without forgetting, and share those stories with their children and grandchildren, so that future generations might also trust in the Lord.

This principle is crucial for us too, isn't it? As Christians, we remember the marvelous things the Lord has done for us—how He came into the world as a human being, enduring the same hardships and suffering we face. We know how Jesus saved us by laying down His life on the cross to free us from sin, guilt, and evil; and how He rose from the dead, promising to share that victory with those who trust in Him. We know these stories—now let's share them with our children and grandchildren. Let's make it part of our bedtime routines, tell them during long car trips, or use them to offer comfort when they are afraid or lonely. By doing so, we help ensure they, too, come to know and believe in the one true God who loves them more than anything... as His children.
