Psalm 103:1-2 - Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless His Holy Name! Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits.

"Did you see the game yesterday!?!" In countless workplaces on Monday morning, across these Unites States, that will be an exclamation and question that will be spoken again and again by friends and coworkers around coffee makers





and water coolers. What will follow will be a lively discussion about our team and our players... especially if our team won and our favorite players did well in fantasy. We'll praise the coach for his in game decisions and adjustments. We'll praise the players for their game saving runs, throws, catches and tackles. We'll praise the excitement of a hard fought, heart pounding victory. In fact, what will happen around coffee makers and water coolers on Monday won't be something additional to the game's enjoyment from the previous day... it will be the pinnacle of it: our excitement and praise.

Praising is a fully human, communal activity—it's the mountaintop of joy. But, like every other mountaintop experience, it doesn't last. It's not that the qualities of the praiseworthy thing have vanished, rather, it's that our enjoyment doesn't last. The lively lunchroom banter gives way to spreadsheets, job sites and deadlines. For something that is so vital for making us fully human, it's strange that it doesn't last.

Like a lot of things in this mortal life, this life is a series of let-downs—fading memories, fleeting joys, ephemeral praise. For instance, your favorite player might get hurt on the 4th play of the game and suddenly all the praise is over before it even started. It is then we might wonder, "So, is this all there is?" Perhaps the fleeting nature of our praise shows us that we are not yet giving the praise we were created to make. And so we must confess, "Lord your greatness is beyond our highest praise!"

That's how the poets who penned the book of Psalms saw it. They believed that praising is our purpose and that praising our Creator will be the fulfillment of our deepest longing, our greatest joy. And, to miss out on that, to be left out, to not have a place in heaven's sanctuary that would be the greatest loss of all. And so, when the psalmist prompts his own soul to bless the LORD, to remember all the LORD's benefits, he knows that praising the Creator will be the fulfillment of his greatest joy. And we know that when the risen Jesus returns—Jesus who once suffered that hell for us on the cross—when He returns to raise the dead and make all things new, then comes the victory, then the enduring joy, and then the ceaseless praise.


Saturday, September 16th at 9:00 AM

A Story That Makes Sense of Life






