

Twisted Truths

"Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, so help you God?" Witnesses are asked to take that oath in court. Perhaps you have been asked to take such an oath before. In an election year every political candidate wants us to believe that they are telling us "the truth, the whole truth, and nothing



but the truth" ... but we know better. It seems that people are always twisting the truth and we would like some assurance that we are being told the truth.

Twisting the truth is certainly not a new phenomenon, and it doesn't only occur in election years. Twisting the truth goes all the way back to the beginning of time in the Garden of Eden when the Devil told the first lie.

Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?" 2 The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, 3 but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'" 4 "You will not certainly die," the serpent said to the woman. 5 "For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." (Genesis 3:1-5 NIV)

In fact, that is all the devil can do. He lies. Jesus describes him like this, "When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies" (John 8:44). The devil loves twisting the truth. Can you see that in how he tempted Eve? He took God's words, twisted them to change their true meaning, and tried to convince Eve that it was what God had really said.

Fast forward about 6000 years. Still today the greatest dangers to our faith come when people who claim to be speaking for God twist the truth. "God is love, so all lifestyles are acceptable." "Jesus says not to judge, so you have no right to point out sin." "Jesus died for everyone, so there's no way God would ever send someone to hell." We could fill pages of twisted truths that the Devi has convinced people to believe today. The problem with twisted truths is that usually they sound good, they look morally acceptable, and they make us feel good... and that's what makes them so dangerous. Paul spoke about those who twist the truth. "In fact, such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, masquerading as apostles of Christ. And no wonder, for Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light." (2 Corinthians 11:13-14)



So how do we know what is truth, what is a "twisted truth", and what is a total lie? Eve knew just what to do. She answered the devil's first half-truth with the Word of God: "God *did say…*" Yes! The Word of God is the sword of the Spirit that destroys the devil's lies. The writer of Hebrews said, "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any double-edged sword. It penetrates even to the point of dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow, even being able to judge the ideas and thoughts of the heart." (Hebrews 4:12)

Except, does the devil only tempt us one time? Sadly, no. He came right back to Eve with another twisted lie, and Eve finally gave in and sinned. The Devil only leaves us until he sees another opportune moment to attack us. Attacked, when the devil has opportunity to whisper in our ears and to place doubts in hearts, fear in our minds, lust in eyes, and evil in our hands. Attacked, when we are placed right in the midst of our greatest weaknesses, our most difficult addictions, and our favorite sins. Attacked, when we are at our weakest physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Attacked, when we are ridiculed for our faith as Satan tries to convince you that there has got to be an easier way to live than by the cross. And when Satan attacks what is going to enable you to *"stand your ground"*? Are you prepared for that moment?

Paul writes, "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power." (Ephesians 6:10) When we grow stronger in our knowledge and understanding of God's promises we grow stronger in the truth, because "his word is truth" (John 17:17. We need God's Word in our hearts and minds and homes. What could you do to make God's Word even more a part of your family's routine? In the morning when you rise. In the car while you drive. With you family as you eat. In your beds before you sleep. Throughout the day there are more opportunities to grow stronger in God's promises than there are opportune moments for Satan to attack us. "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power." That's the truth. That's the whole truth. And that's nothing but the truth. So help me God!


Theft / Malicious Activity Report

Although this school year will be much different than any other year, I really look forward to working with the students and pray that God continues to bless the school and families at Grace!




