- M: Let us come before the LORD with Thanksgiving,
- C: And extol Him with music and song!
- M: For you make me glad by your deeds, O LORD; I sing for joy at the works of your hands.
- C: How great are your works, O LORD, how profound your thoughts!
- M: Praise the LORD. Praise the LORD from the heavens, praise him in the heights above.
- C: Praise him, all his angels, praise him, all his heavenly hosts.
- M: Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all you shining stars.
- C: Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies.
- M: Praise the name of the LORD, for his name alone is exalted.
- C: His splendor is above the earth and the heavens. Praise the LORD.
- M: We are filled with the good things of your house, of your holy temple.
- C: You answer us with awesome deeds of righteousness, O God our Savior.

Reading: John 17:13-21

13 "I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them. 14 I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world. 15 My prayer is not that you take them



out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. <sup>16</sup> They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. <sup>17</sup> Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth... I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, <sup>21</sup> that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.
