The First Lesson: 1 John 5:13-15

¹³ I have written these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴ This is the confidence that we have before him: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. ¹⁵ And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we also know that we receive the things we have asked from him.

The Gospel Lesson: LUKE 18:1-18

Jesus told them a parable about the need to always pray and not lose heart: ² "There was a judge in a certain town who did not fear God and did not care about people. ³ There was a widow in that town, and she kept going to him, saying, 'Give me justice from my adversary!' ⁴ For some time he refused, but after a while he said to himself, 'Even though I do not fear God or care about people, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice so that she will not wear me out with her endless pleading.""

⁶The Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷Will not God give justice to his chosen ones, who are crying out to him day and night? Will he put off helping them? ⁸I tell you that he will give them justice quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"
